Minutes of the 2022 MSOM Business Meeting at MSOM 2022

Time: 12:15pm-1:45pm CST Monday, June 27th, 2022.

Location: Munich, Germany.

- 1. President Feryal Erhun welcomed the participants and started the meeting by introducing the agenda and the set-up for the meeting.
- 2. Secretary/Treasurer Tim Kraft gave an update on membership, finances, and the bylaws.
 - a. Membership has increased since the dip that occurred during the pandemic. But we must continue to work to increase numbers (we are still short of our pre-pandemic numbers).
 - b. Our student population remains low compared to pre-pandemic numbers. Please continue to help and support your students to join.
 - c. Regular members please check your membership multiple times this past year we discovered established leaders in the society were not members. This can make it difficult to form the necessary committees for awards, initiatives, etc.
 - d. Finances were approximately breakeven this past year. Pre-pandemic we often had a positive gain. Awards cost has gone up with the increase in number of awards. Also, we need to continue to increase membership (and increase due revenues).
 - e. The bylaws and awards updates have been made. The service award honorarium has been increased from \$400 to \$1000. A \$2000 honorarium for Fellows passed, however the vote was close and after consulting all previous Fellows, the board decided not to add the honorarium.

- ii. 9 papers were passed to M&SOM DE and AEs for potential fast track, with 7 being put into the fast-track process
- iii. Lessons learned from the fast-track process
 - 1. We need to be more careful about the selection of reviewers (e.g., willingness to continue, expertise, CoI, etc.)
 - 2. Although the reviews we received are much improved, can we make them even better?
 - 3. How can we make the transition from the SIG chairs to the journal smoother?

 - i. MSOM has no members from African countries; there have been no publications by authors from African countries in MS, M&SOM, or OR since 2010
 - The goal of the Africa Initiative is to stimulate collaborative research that would enrich the OM professional community in research and teaching, as well as in diversity and inclusivity
 - iii. There is an African related session in the MSOM conference
 - iv. There is an MSOM session in the 2022 CARISCA Summit thank you Jonas Jónasson for your work on this!
 - v. We are working with AFROS to establish an MSOM track.
 - vi. We will begin a MSOM seminar series to disseminate OM and SCM skills targeted for universities in Africa

- d. Area editor changes in 2022: Devavrat Shah (MLDS); Neil Walton/Raman Randhawa (SM)
- e. Reproducibility: Online supplements for code/data

- g. Enhancements: XML, video supplements for papers
- h. Review of 2021 submissions and turnaround time
 - i. Trends: Time to review decreasing, impact factor increasing, usage went up 1/3 which is good.
 - ii. Article influence and centrality are also both very high (and better measures than impact factor)

15. Editor-in-Chief David Simchi-Levi gave an update on Management Science

- a. Review of 2021 submissions and turnaround time
 - i. Total submissions were ~4300 last year, significantly increased from last year. Overall acceptance rate remains stable at 10-11% (stable); fast track 8% acceptance rate.
 - ii. Review time was approximately 80 days for first reviews. The median time to final decisions was less than 100 days.
 - iii. There MS papers cited in the US Economic Report; also, MS citations in SC resiliency report.
 - iv. 654 papers submitted to OM-related departments.
- b. MS Best AE Award was given to Prof. Xuanming Su from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania.
- c. Updated on the Data Replication project.

- i. 90% of papers come with data to MS.
- ii. 10 Behavioral OM papers were chosen to replicate. Faculty from 5 univs have helped to conduct the studies. The results should be published soon.
- d. Announcement of the new special issue on The Human Algorithm Connection. Submission deadline September 9, 2022.
