Public Works Foundations

What is the Public Works Foundations course?

This course is one of eight **Public Works Foundations Program** courses curated by IPWEA Victoria to develop the skills of public works professionals in key responsibility areas. Each course comprises four 4-hour sessions presented over consecutive weeks.

Course Overview

Public works professionals are responsible for the design, construction and maintenance of community infrastructure. Typically employed by state government (e.g. water authorities) or local government (i.e. Councils), they may alternatively have a private sector employer but be engaged to provide specialist design advice to state or local government clients.

This course provides insights into the breadth of public works engineering and the unique governance requirements of a public sector role.

Session 2: Traffic, Transport and Roads Session 4: Capital Works & Asset Management

Learning Objectives

After completing this course, participants should have a foundational understanding of:

- Federal, state and local government infrastructure responsibilities
- Local government functions, legislation, structure and powers
- Council Engineering Directorate roles, responsibilities, relationships and obligations
- Traffic management, public safety, accessibility and efficiency
- Road management, design, construction and maintenance
- Stabilisation fundamentals and pavement design, construction and maintenance
- Land development challenges, opportunities and success factors
- Subdivision design, statutory planning and construction supervision
- Integrated water management, water quality improvement, urban green and cooling
- Project management, leadership, costing and quality delivery
- Procurement principles, roles and responsibilities, methods and bid evaluation
- Infrastructure asset management, sustainable service delivery and financial planning
