






THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 2002 AMENDMENT BILL (NO 2) – Submissions closed 28 July 16

- Greater flexibility for Councils to use jointly-owned CCOs (Water and Transport)
- The management of jointly-owned CCOs through joint committees.
- Elected members will be prohibited from sitting on the boards of jointly-owned CCOs.
- Water and transport CCOs with powers under the Public Works Act 1981
- Accountability of CCOs, including requirements to give effect to a Council's LTP and SOI (Infrastructure Strategy)
- The introduction of a 'substantive' CCO > \$10 million (not restricted to water and roads)
- Councils able to prescribe benchmarks for assessing prudent management with respect to revenue, expenses, assets, liabilities & investments implications for holding companies.
- Encourage Councils to work together to develop and consult on re-organisation proposals
- A more active role for the Local Government Commission.
- Changes to Council governance, consistent with Treaty settlements and iwi involvement,
- The Commission ensures Treaty settlement arrangements are reflected in reorganisation proposals.
