IPWEA has implemented significant work to deliver nationally consistent approaches to asset and financial management under the Local Government Reform Fund.

WORLD-CLASS RESOURCES

The IPWEA launched the *International Infrastructure Management Manual 2011*, the *Plant & Vehicle Management Manual 2012*, and Practice Notes for Stormwater Drainage and Long-term Financial Planning.

ENHANCED COMMUNICATIONS

The IPWEA has relaunched *Public Works Professional* magazine, launched the ASSET and FLEET e-newsletters, developed a smartphone app and created leading online Communities of Practice and discussion forums. The IPWEA website won an international award.

TACKLING SUSTAINABILITY

The IPWEA has secured ACELG funding to scope and define a national sustainability strategy. Dr Stephen Lees has been appointed National Director Sustainability.

STRONGER GOVERNANCE

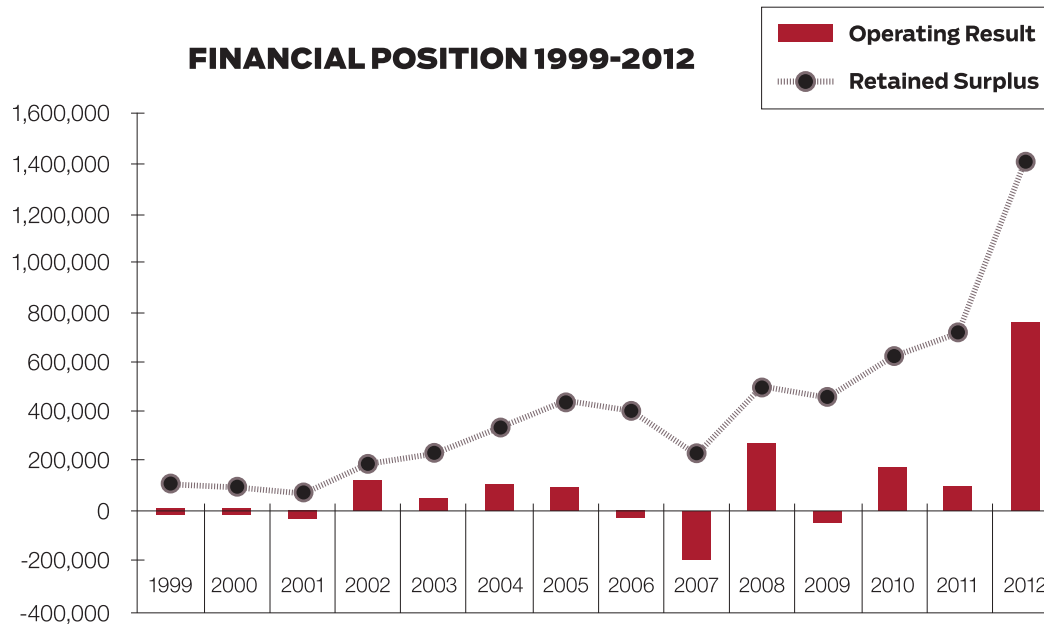
A complete governance review was undertaken and improvements were implemented. Furthermore, a Risk and Audit Committee was established. Organisational growth continues.
