



IPWEA's Professional Certificate in Asset Management Planning contributes to Australian Graduate School of Management's Certificate in Executive Management and Development professional development pathway.

The Institute of Public Works Engineering (IPWEA) is pleased to announce that the Australian Graduate School of Management (AGSM) at University of NSW Sydney (UNSW, Sydney) will recognise completion of IPWEA's Professional Certificate in Asset Management Planning as part of its Certificate in Executive and Management and Development professional development pathway.
