- **Keynote - Annabell Berry - Sapphire CEO**

Appointed as Chief Executive Officer of Sapphire in 2015, with a career spanning over 23 years in the cyber security industry, Annabel has been recognised by CRN as one of the most influential women in the UK IT channel and included in their A-List since 2019. Excelling in leadership, the development and implementation of new strategies and identifying emerging technologies, Annabel also takes an active involvement in encouraging more women into the cyber security industry. She is proud to be a Director of the Ladies of London Hacking Society, a board member for We Are Radikal, an organisation that helps women entrepreneurs recognise their ambitions and also a Leadership Fellow at St. George's House, Windsor Castle.

- **Mazars - Cloud Strategy Adoption – Risks and Opportunities**

Session will include an intro to the typically consumed cloud technologies and services, including IaaS, PaaS and SaaS. We will then discuss a typical cloud journey that a business may take, from identifying server workloads for infrastructure migration through to full cloud adoption, and how to incorporate this within a strategy and roadmap. The session will highlight key risks and challenges associated with cloud adoption, as well as the opportunities.





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- **NCC - Monty Youngs - Principal Consultant, Transport Governance and Risk Advisory Lead**

Monty is a Principal Consultant within NCC Group's Global Professional Services with over 30 years of experience in security, risk, and threat intelligence spanning multiple sectors including Defence and Security, Government, Financial Services, Legal and Professional Services, Manufacturing and Transport. As the lead for Transport Governance and UK Risk Advisory, Monty has created and maintains NCC's support packages to vehicle manufacturers, and their suppliers, in response to the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) regulations for cyber security on automated, autonomous, and connected cars.

UNECE Regulation 155 introduces a new set of challenges for the automotive manufacturing sector and its supply chains. The regulation requires the creation, implementation, and maintenance of both organisational and project specific cyber security management systems. These requirements span across any existing information security management systems, quality management systems and secure development policies and procedures. The response from the sector has been varied ahead of the first vehicles to be homologated from June 2022. This aim of the presentation is to highlight some of the common lessons from organisational IT that can be applied to the OEMs and system developments.

- **Stuart Robertson - Phoenix Group - CISO**

Stuart Robertson is CISO at Phoenix Group. Phoenix are the UK's largest pensions and savings business with over 14m policy holders. Prior to joining Phoenix, Stuart was CISO at Standard Life where he also held various IT Leadership roles prior to becoming responsible for protecting the organisation from Cyber threats.

- **Adrian Shaw - Nettitude - Principal Incident Response Consultant**

Presentation: Conti Ransomware – Pwn All The Things. Case study: Incident Response for organization over-run with ransomware.

Adrian has over 20 years' experience in the Information Security field, having previously spent 13 years as a Police Detective investigating cyber-crime and conducting over 500 computer forensic examinations. He has been published in scientific journals for his ground-breaking work on dealing with large backlogs of computer forensic examinations. Since moving to Nettitude, Adrian has led numerous Incident Response engagements ranging from insider threats, data exfiltration, and widespread ransomware infections.





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- **Alastair Steward and Philip Street - URM**

On the 31st March 2022, the Payment Card Industry Security Standards Council (PCI SSC) released version 4.0 of the PCI Data Security Standard (PCI DSS), a global standard which established a baseline of technical and operational requirements for protecting payment card information.

Alastair and Philip will provide an overview of the new standard which is being updated to address evolving risks and changes in the security landscape, reinforce security as a continuous process and to support the use of different technologies.
