How to use AI in a responsible matter: mastering risk, maximizing impact.

In a world increasingly driven by artificial intelligence (AI), the strategic integration of Responsible AI (RAI) is no longer optional—it is a competitive necessity.

This session provides a practical framework for moving beyond compliance, linking robust AI Governance directly to ESG principles and measurable business value. We will explore how organizations can deploy AI wisely, ensuring initiatives add true value rather than being driven by the fear of missing out (FOMO).

The presentation will analyze the critical trade-offs that must be made between maximizing innovation opportunities and mitigating complex risks to the organization and its individuals. Finally, we will detail the essential implementation of responsible AI from design to execution, clarifying what a solid AI Audit entails, and spotlighting the professionalization of the field through ISACA certifications and the role of the International Association of AI Auditors (IAAA).

Participants will gain a thorough understanding of the strategic, ethical, and organizational components required to build a sustainable RAI program. This knowledge will equip them with the skills to audit AI systems effectively, drive governance structures that maximize positive impact, and lead their organizations in developing trustworthy, value-driven AI ecosystems that are resilient in the short and long run.
