Spotlight Topic #1 -Remote Access Attack on Florida Water Supply

On February 5th, an unknown intruder attempted to poison the water supply of the small Florida town of Oldsmar via a remote access attack on the waterwork's water treatment system. Local law enforcement held a press conference informing the public that a city employee was conducting remote maintenance on the treatment system using Teamviewer, a popular remote access tool, when they noticed the cursor on the system was moving on its own. Soon after, it was noticed that the amount of Sodium Hydroxide (known more commonly as lye) was adjusted to 100 times the normal level. Fortunately, the city employee caught this adjustment in real-time and was able to revert the levels to normal. City officials stated that multiple safeguards are in place to prevent water with dangerous amounts

of any substance from reaching the general public and that any changes to the water treatment system do not immediately take effect. The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office noted that the investigation is ongoing and that the FBI and Secret Service are assisting with the investigation. The attack highlights the growing concern over the nation's water treatment infrastructure and its resiliency against cyberattacks. The 'America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018' requires water treatment systems serving 3,300 or more residents to develop risk assessments and incident response plans. Industry experts note that regulatory requirements fail to address systemic issues related to funding, staffing, and technology which plague many of the country's 54,000 water drinking treatment systems and leave them vulnerable to attack.
