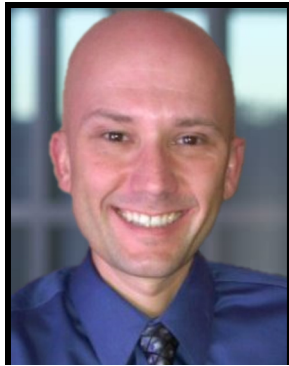


Letter from the President

Topic: "AWS Security, its keystone concepts and how it differs from traditional data centers"

Presenter: Rahul Raghavan (Co-Founder and Chief Evangelist, we45)

Description: AWS is extensively used by organizations, large and small. The breadth of service offerings within AWS is staggering. From Serverless to IaaS Services, AWS has comprehensive solutions that can power any organization. However, security on AWS is often treated similar to Enterprise security. Organizations look to adopt similar templates of Perimeter Protection, Cryptography and so on, on their AWS environments, as they would, for collocated or private cloud environments. This is not a scalable or effective strategy. This talk provides an attack and defense perspective of AWS security. We will look at how attackers view resources on AWS, leverage vulnerabilities and elevate privileges therefrom and look at some common practices for defense, in terms of identifying and mitigating vulnerabilities in our AWS deployment.

Bio: The sheer pervasiveness of applications, their associated software engineering process and therefore the variance of application security quotient across software teams is what drives Rahul's primary role as an AppSec Advocate at we45. As an active DevSecOps Marketer, Rahul works closely with the offices of CTOs and CIOs in the setting up of cross-functional skill-building and collaboration models between engineering, QA and security teams to build and manage software security maturity frameworks. Rahul is a CISA and is a regular speaker at global conferences, seminars and meetup groups.

Topic: "Putting the S in GRC"

Presenter: Jose Lineros, Phd, CISA, CPA

Bio: Jose is a clinical assistant professor in the University of North Texas accounting department. He teaches graduate IT Audit, Internal Audit, and MIS courses. His current research area is in blockchain integration and the network vulnerabilities that distributed network technologies present.

Description: Smart Contract integration with blockchains represents a potential revolution in how business parties interact and settle asset transfers. Opportunities and challenges abound as this distributed ledger technology continues to evolve.

ISACA North Texas Events Policy

The ISACA North Texas Chapter offers three types of fee based programs: Chapter Monthly Meetings, CISA® and CISM® Review Courses, and Seminars.

The chapter strongly encourages advance registration and payment for all events, as this reduces chapter expenses and the capacity for many of our events is limited due to the size of the event locations. Therefore, seats may not be available on the day of the event for walk-up registrants. The table on the final page of this newsletter summarizes the chapter's payment and cancellation policies.

Payment Policy

- All advance, online event registration payments will be made through CVENT. For advance, online registrations, payment is accepted via Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and PayPal.
- Advance registrations will not be accepted after the time noted above unless otherwise noted in online event details.
- For walk-in registrations, credit card via Cvent, check, cash or Paypal payment is required.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

The North Texas Chapter of ISACA (ISACA NTX) strives to provide appropriate facilities for meetings, seminars and certification review classes. Since facility providers and/or speakers require advance notice and financial commitment, ISACA NTX must balance those obligations against our members' periodic need to cancel a reservation based on job requirements, illness or other circumstances.

Upon receipt of e-mail notification to reservations@isaca-northtexas.org, ISACA NTX will refund prepaid fee according to the following deadlines:

- **Monthly Program Meetings** - cancellations must be received by 6:00 PM three days prior to the meeting.
- **Certification Reviews** - cancellations must be received at by 6:00 PM eight days before the first class.
- **Seminars** - cancellations must be received by at least one week prior to the first day of the seminar. If unusual cancellation terms are required based on speaker and/or venue, details will be included in the online event details.

Attendee substitution is permitted at any time until the event by contacting the Registration Coordinator at reservations@isaca-northtexas.org and is subject to any additional charge for non-member fees.

Cancellations and refund for advance registrations are allowed if cancellations are submitted to reservations@isaca-northtexas.org by the deadline noted in the table above.

Advance registrants who do not attend the event or do not cancel by the date noted in the table above are not eligible for a refund.
