Topic: "Blockchain: Where are we Now and Where are we Heading?"

Presenter: Peter Kipp, CPA, Ph.D. - Assistant Professor of Accounting at the University of North Texas

Description: Blockchain technology has received significant interest from the popular business press, company executives, and accounting professionals. This presentation will present background information on blockchain, its capabilities, and its limitations. Examples of current blockchain implementation in practice, misconceptions, and suggestions for adoption will be provided.

Bio: Peter is in his second year as accounting faculty at the University of North Texas where he teaches Information Systems. His research interests include human judgment and decision-making in audit and AIS. His empirical research has been published in the *Journal of Information Systems*. Currently, Peter is investigating how autonomous systems and intelligent agents moderate the judgments and actions of human actors. Peter completed his Ph.D. at the University of South Florida and his Masters in Professional Accounting at the University of Texas at Austin and maintains an active CPA license in the state of Kansas.

Objectives - Attendees will learn about:

- Understand the fundamental technologies that underlie a blockchain
- Describe the different consensus protocols (e.g., proof of work, proof of stake, proof of elapsed time, etc.), their advantages, and their disadvantages
- Understand the limitations of blockchain technology
- Examples from practice of current blockchain implementation
- Understand where blockchain may be adopted within your organization and risks that will need to be addressed before implementation

Topic: "The Legal Perspective of a Data Breach"

Presenter: Jeremy Rucker - Data Privacy and Cybersecurity Attorney

Description: Cybersecurity is increasingly becoming not only a business and technical issue, but also a legal issue. Being on the front lines of cybersecurity incidents, IT personnel play an important role in the ability to successfully respond to data incidents within the letter and spirit of the applicable laws. This discussion will provide IT personnel perspectives into the legal considerations which should be taken into account when initially responding to data incidents.

Speaker Bio: Jeremy is a data privacy and cybersecurity attorney in the Dallas office of Spencer Fane LLP. Jeremy assists companies in handling cybersecurity and data privacy incidents. In the past year alone, Jeremy has assisted over seventy-five organizations in their data breach response efforts. The expertise of Jeremy and his Spencer Fane colleagues cover all industries impacted by cyber and privacy issues including healthcare, banking and finance, insurance, energy, transportation, and manufacturing.

- Highlight the legal obligations surrounding data breach incidents
- Analyze legal trends in data privacy and cybersecurity laws
- Provide a framework for responding to data incidents

Post-Luncheon 1:30 PM

Topic: "Securing the Digital Workplace"

Presenter: Anand Singh, Ph.D.

Description: Digital workplaces have become prevalent across the board. Primary drivers are the employees who consume digital technologies such as IoT, AR and VR. The plethora of mobile devices has enabled them to work where they want and when they want which has raised the bar on employee expectations for tools and capabilities from their employers. In order for companies to retain the best and get the most out of their employees, it is vital to design and continually update the digital workplace. This distributed environment has led to significant challenges and diluted the ability to secure the digital workplace. In this session, we will discuss the current trends as well as share case studies of successful digital workplace implementations.

Speaker Bio: Most recently, Anand was the CISO at Caliber Home Loans. In prior roles, he has led Information Security for OptumInsight, a UnitedHealth Group company as well as for <u>target.com</u>. He also led adoption of Optum Cloud in healthcare industry. Anand has actively shaped the information security industry in his impressive career. He is an author with publications in many prestigious journals. As a keynote speaker, he has shared his knowledge and learning on topics on information security, innovation, cloud technologies and regulatory compliance. He is also an adjunct professor at Mitchell Hamline School of Law teaching Incident Management and Response. Anand has a PhD in Computer Science from University of Minnesota and M.S. in Computer Science from Purdue University. Dr. Singh also holds CISM and CISSP professional certifications.

ISACA North Texas Events Policy

The ISACA North Texas Chapter offers three types of fee based programs: Chapter Monthly Meetings, CISA® and CISM® Review Courses, and Seminars.

The chapter strongly encourages advance registration and payment for all events, as this reduces chapter expenses and the capacity for many of our events is limited due to the size of the event locations. Therefore, seats may not be available on the day of the event for walk-up registrants. The table on the final page of this newsletter summarizes the chapter's payment and cancellation policies.

Payment Policy

- All advance, online event registration payments will be made through CVENT. For advance, online registrations, payment is accepted via Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and PayPal.
- Advance registrations will not be accepted after the time noted above unless otherwise noted in online event details.
- For walk-in registrations, credit card via Cvent, check, cash or Paypal payment is required.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

The North Texas Chapter of ISACA (ISACA NTX) strives to provide appropriate facilities for meetings, seminars and certification review classes. Since facility providers and/or speakers require advance notice and financial commitment, ISACA NTX must balance those obligations against our members' periodic need to cancel a reservation based on job requirements, illness or other circumstances.

Upon receipt of e-mail notification to reservations@isaca-northtexas.org, ISACA NTX will refund prepaid fee according to the following deadlines:

- Monthly Program Meetings cancellations must be received by 6:00 PM three days prior to the meeting.
- Certification Reviews cancellations must be received at by 6:00 PM eight days before the first class.
