Description: This presentation is a deep dive into the results of a survey conducted by ISACA with IT auditors in August 2018. The survey results show that auditors are increasingly becoming an integral part of or strong partners to an organization's technology team and expect their level of involvement to improve in the next three to five years. While it is a commendable development, advances in information technology would continue to pose grave challenges especially in technical areas such as Cloud Architecture, Robotics, Automation, Al and Machine learning. Additionally, evolution of operational techniques and tooling in areas such as SDLC with Agile, JIRA, Kanban, etc. are bringing renewed challenges to the auditor's ability to perform audits and adequately assess controls.

Bio: Eric is an established IT Risk and Information Security leader with over 20 years of professional experience. Prior to joining Schwab he held leadership positions at Ocwen Financial, DTCC, Gerdau and WebMD.

Justus is a seasoned IT audit and risk professional with more than 15 years combined experience in consulting and industry. Prior to joining Charles Schwab, Justus held positions at JPMorgan Chase, Ocwen Financial Corporation and Deloitte.

Topic: "Banking Data Breach: Lessons Learned"

Presenter: Eddie Ho, Former CISO, CIO, COO of Community Banks

Bio: Eddie Ho is the former COO and CIO for Los Alamos National Bank in New Mexico and CIO and CISO at OmniAmerican Bank in Texas. Prior to banking leadership roles, Eddie was in Technology Risk Management, cyber security, and Enterprise Architecture for IBM, Dell, Grant Thornton, and Blockbuster. Eddie is a board member for ePayAdvisors and is a frequent speaker for banking and finance industries. Eddie is the author of a network technology book and frequent contributor to industry publications. Eddie holds a BS from the University of Wisconsin, an MS in Computer Science from North Dakota State University, and holds CIPP, CISA, CISM, CGEIT, and CISSP certifications.

Description: Now your financial institution is hacked and on the evening news. Customers, Board, Press, and Regulators are hounding you by the minute. How do you recover step-by-step as CIO/COO/CISO? This session covers data breach nightmares during pre-attack, attack-in-motion, and post attack scenarios. ISACA North Texas Events Policy

Payment Policy

- All advance, online event registration payments will be made through CVENT. For advance, online registrations, payment is accepted via Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and PayPal.
- Advance registrations will not be accepted after the time noted above unless otherwise noted in online event details.
- For walk-in registrations, credit card via Cvent, check, cash or Paypal payment is required.

Cancellation and Refund Policy
