**Presenter:** Peter Kipp, CPA, Ph.D. - Assistant Professor of Accounting at the University of North Texas

**Bio:** Peter is in his third year as accounting faculty at the University of North Texas where he teaches Accounting Systems and Using Information Systems in Accounting. His research interests include human judgment and decision-making in audit and AIS. His empirical research has been published in the Journal of Information Systems. Currently, Peter is investigating how autonomous systems and intelligent agents moderate the judgments and behavior of human actors. Peter completed his Ph.D. at the University of South Florida and his Masters in Professional Accounting at the University of Texas at Austin and maintains an active CPA license in the state of Kansas.

**Description:** Robotic process automation (RPA), machine-learning algorithms, and artificial intelligence (A.I.) technologies are being adopted in practice at an increasing rate. The proliferation of these technologies throughout organizations' operations has attracted the attention of regulators who expect these technologies to transform the financial reporting process. This presentation will present background information on RPA, machine learnings-algorithms, and A.I., their current and future use in practice, and ethical considerations that should be addressed before adoption.

#### Objectives - Attendees will learn about:

- Understand the fundamentals of RPA, different machine-learning algorithms, and A.I. used for financial reporting and other processes
- Examples from practice of current RPA, machine-learning, and A.I. applications and where they may be adopted within your organization
- Discuss regulators interest in and concerns with these emerging technologies
- Discuss the human-machine interaction implications of adopting these emerging technologies and ethical considerations before adoption

#### Pre-Lunch Session 10:00 AM

Topic: "GDPR and CCPA"

**Presenter:** Anke Eckardt, CAE for Lehigh Hanson, Inc / HEIDELBERGCEMENT

**Bio:** Anke oversees the Group Internal Audit team in North America for HeidelbergCement AG, the 3rd largest cement manufacturer and largest provider of Aggregates worldwide. Prior to joining HeidelbergCement, Eckardt worked at Orange Business Services and its predecessors Equant and Global One in a variety of positions, including Head of Transactional Financial Systems, Head of the Shared Service Center Europe and Director Finance Germany.

**Description:** The presentation introduces the EU General Data Protection Regulation, known as GDPR and explains how GDPR may affect US companies. Also presented will be the new California Consumer Protection Act, or CCPA, which becomes effective 01. January 2020. The CCPA is based on the GDPR but there are some differences. Both regulations affect the work auditors do and have to be kept in mind when dealing with personal data.

Topic: "Cybersecurity and the United States Government"

**Presenter:** Special Agent Miguel A. Clarke, FBI

**Bio:** SA Clarke is a graduate of the University of Kansas and joined the FBI in 1998. He investigated Major Drug Trafficking Organizations, Violent Crimes and Multi-national Gangs before joining the National Security Squad in 2000. In 2001, SA Clarke joined the newly created Dallas Cyber Squad. His primary responsibility was investigating criminal computer intrusions within the Northern District and Eastern District of Texas. In 2004, SA Clarke began working National Security cyber cases, exclusively. He was the primary case agent for the United States' efforts to protect the F-35 Joint Strike Fighter from broad-spectrum, Cyber-Counterintelligence threats. In 2008 he served at the National Cyber Investigative Joint Task Force in the Washington, D. C. area. In 2017, SA Clarke joined the Office of the Private Sector program to help coordinate FBI efforts to better engage with Private Sector partners to protect Critical Infrastructure.

**Description:** The presentation addresses: United States Government roles and responsibilities in Cyberspace, The value of Public/Private Partnerships, Cyber threat actors and attack types, and Principles for effective Cyber Security.

# ISACA North Texas Events Policy

The ISACA North Texas Chapter offers three types of fee based programs: Chapter Monthly Meetings, CISA® and CISM® Review Courses, and Seminars.

The chapter strongly encourages advance registration and payment for all events, as this reduces chapter expenses and the capacity for many of our events is limited due to the size of the event locations. Therefore, seats may not be available on the day of the event for walk-up registrants. The table on the final page of this newsletter summarizes the chapter's payment and cancellation policies.

#### **Payment Policy**

- All advance, online event registration payments will be made through CVENT. For advance, online registrations, payment is accepted via Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and PayPal.
- Advance registrations will not be accepted after the time noted above unless otherwise noted in online event details.
- For walk-in registrations, credit card via Cvent, check, cash or Paypal payment is required.

#### **Cancellation and Refund Policy**

The North Texas Chapter of ISACA (ISACA NTX) strives to provide appropriate facilities for meetings, seminars and certification review classes. Since facility providers and/or speakers require advance notice and financial commitment, ISACA NTX must balance those obligations against our members' periodic need to cancel a reservation based on job requirements, illness or other circumstances.

Upon receipt of e-mail notification to reservations@isaca-northtexas.org, ISACA NTX will refund prepaid fee according to the following deadlines:

- Monthly Program Meetings cancellations must be received by 6:00 PM three days prior to the meeting.
- Certification Reviews cancellations must be received at by 6:00 PM eight days before the first class.
