- 1. Discussion regarding Appearance. Concern about multi-complaints which does the attorney appearance work with..too confusing as proposed. Back to drawing board.
- 2. Post- Judgment discovery; move to amend pursuant to the proposal . Unanimous approval. As follows:

Amendment of MCR 2.302 to read:

RULE 2.302 GENERAL RULES GOVERNING DISCOVERY

- (A) Availability of Discovery.
- (1) After commencement of an action, parties may obtain discovery by any means provided in subchapter 2.300 of these rules.
- (2) In actions in the district court, no discovery is permitted before entry of judgment except by leave of the court or on the stipulation of all parties. A motion for discovery may not be filed unless the discovery sought has previously been requested and refused.
- (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of this or any other rule, discovery is not permitted in actions in the small claims division of the district court or in civil infraction actions.
- (4) For purposes of this subchapter, the "commencement of an action" includes the filing of postjudgment motions brought in "Domestic Relations Actions," as defined by subchapter 3.200 of these

rules.

- 3. "Unauthorized Practice of Law" Jim Harrington was at the hearing at Rep. Assembly.; Rep assents overwhelmingly by approved proposed language on the UPL
- 4. Default Proposal- Jim Harrington attended the meeting on phone; streamline entry of default; the court will have the discretion to permit defaulter to participate; this was good compromise; got rid of offensive "not otherwise admissible"; May 16,there will be a hearing at Supreme Court; motion to approve amended default; lots of discussion; move to approve: 16-1 opposed

The \$2500 contribution represents a silver level sponsorship for the Family Law Institute. The purpose of the contribution/ sponsorship is to promote increased attendance to new lawyers and to let new lawyers attend a program they might not otherwise be able to attend, given the economy and the lack of jobs for new attorneys.

Most importantly, however, It is meant to be a collaborative outreach to new lawyers by ICLE and the Family Law Section, and a way for the Section to also increase its new lawyer members.

For the two State Bar sections we also have that arrangement with, we list them in the brochure as a financial sponsor.

Last year we had 50 new lawyers attend the Family Law Institute and I believe that with this promotion we will far exceed that amount. The \$2500 contribution by the Section is <u>not</u> intended to cover the cost to ICLE of offering the promotion (in reality it represents only a fraction of the actual cost for this program), but rather is a silver sponsor level with full recognition given to the Section.

In short, we are requesting the full \$2500 from the Section to be a silver sponsor for the "50 for \$50" promotion and not a per capita donation based upon the number of new lawyers, up to 50, who attend.
