## **Mediating Attorney Fee Disputes**

Attorney fee disputes can be challenging for mediators. When the value of an attorney's services is questioned, things tend to get contentious. Often the mediation involves parties disputing the amount of a fee after a fee shifting statute or court rule is in effect. Other times the mediation is between an attorney and former client. On occasion, a judge may have sanctioned a party or attorney, reserving the amount for a future hearing if the parties cannot reach an agreement.

These disputes are difficult to resolve because of perceptions, personalities, pride, and sometimes downright bad behavior by one or more participants. To be effective, the mediator must have a basic understanding of attorney fees, fee agreements and related legal and equitable issues. The mediator must be able to marshal this understanding to identify the issues, build trust, build consensus where possible, and help develop workable solutions toward an agreement.
