C. Minutes of February 16, 2023 Regular Meeting - emailed w/ agenda

Minutes from the February 16, 2023 Regular Meeting were emailed with the Agenda. Submitted for approval. Tiffany Burks moved to approve the minutes. William Ladd seconded. Minutes approved unanimously.

D. Chair Report (Terina Carte)

II. Standing Committee Reports

- A. Legislation/Agency (Chair Josh Pease) report emailed w/ agenda
 - 1. Life without parole elimination bill 119-123 SBs 119, 120, 121, 122, & 123 This is a package of bills which would eliminate life without parole for an offense committed when the defendant was younger than 19. The bills would have the following effect:
 - a. 119: No life without parole if the defendant was younger than 19 at the time of the offense.
 - b. 120: Parole eligible after 10 years if convicted of or serving a sentence for a crime for which the punishment is presently mandatory LWOP if the defendant was younger than 19 at the time of the offense; three criteria for the parole board to consider.
 - c. 121: No LWOP for designated cases.
 - d. 122 & 123: 10 year minimum and 60 year maximum for offenses with mandatory LWOP if defendant was younger than 19 at time of offense; adding 750.506b barring LWOP if defendant was younger than 19 at the time of offense.

The committee voted to support the bills with one amendment. In SB 120, we supported changing the first sentence of (9)(b) from "The prisoner may be represented at the interview by an individual of the prisoner's choice" to "The prisoner may have present at the interview an individual of the prisoner's choice" to avoid the possibility of the unauthorized practice of law.

Josh Pease moved to support the senate bills with the stated modification. Seconded by Steven Heisler. Motion passed 10-1.

2. SBs 137 & 138 – These two bills would amend the statutes providing subsidy in juvenile guardianships to allow guardians to receive subsidy if the guardianship order came from a tribal court or a court outside of Michigan. The committee was generally supportive of the proposals but felt that the statute as a whole could use revision. Members of the committee are drafting alternative language for us

to consider at the April meeting.

- 3. HB 4019 This bill is a reintroduction of the reinstatement of parental rights bill from last session. We had hoped that the sponsor, Rep. Graham Filler, could attend our committee meeting this month, but he could not. We understand that he may be at the April meeting. Either way, we intend to take this bill up at the April meeting.
- B. Amicus (Chair Paula Aylward)

<u>In re Bourbeau Minors</u>, MSC #165225; COA #360286, pending on application in MSC. The Amicus Committee has decided not to take action on this until the Supreme Court decides.

<u>In re Holbrook Minor</u>, MSC #164489; COA #359504, pending on application in MSC. The Council held an e-vote allowing a brief to be filed concurring with the LGAL.

G. Youth Representation (Chair - Josh Pease)

The Youth Representation Committee met on March 13. Seven committee members were present. They focused on two main topics, one of which is an action item:

1. Encouraging LGALs to file appeals. This evolved into a discussion about training for LGALs and reviving the SCAO child welfare trainings which stopped with COVID. They intend to speak with SCAO about what needs to be done to restart the trainings or, alternatively, institute new LGAL trainings. This would include training regarding appellate practice and representing children on appeal.

2. Mentorship. The committee agreed that a mentorship program through our section would benefit younger and less experienced attorneys in children's law. They could accomplish this through periodic (1-2 times per month) open forums on Zoom for attorneys to meet, socialize, network, and consult on cases while also allowing for more private conversations and consultations through breakout rooms. This forum could further serve to establish more traditional mentor-mentee relationships by connecting practitioners with each other. Council support needed before setting up this forum.

Josh Pease moved to allow exploration of at least monthly Zoom meetings for the purpose of establishing a mentorship program. Seconded by Amanda Pollard. Josh withdrew this motion.

Josh Pease moved for Council approval to create a plan for Zoom forums for discussion of children's law issues. Seconded by Bill Ladd. Motion passed unanimously.

- 3. Supreme Court is creating a taskforce for legal representation in child welfare cases.
- H. Technology (Chair Steve Heisler)

The bylaws reference a couple types of listservs and we do not have a listserv. Steve has a financial interest in a company that provides a listserv and they are willing to provide three (3) months for free. Bylaws need to be updated if we do not use a listserv.

Steve moved to set up a listserv for Council using the company he has an interest in - free of charge for the first 90 days. Seconded by Eric Scott. Motion failed 9 in favor, 0 opposed, 1 abstention.

Steve would like the bylaws updated if SBM Connect is not a listserv.
