Excess Economic Loss in Auto Liability Cases: Remembering the Fundamentals

It is often said that Michigan's auto no-fault law is truly unique. One of the most interesting dynamics created the No Fault Act (MCL 500.3101 et seq.) is what elements of damage can be claimed in a third-party liability claim. Nearly all practitioners remember the axiom that an injured person receives lifetime medical and other "allowable expenses" through their no-fault insurer. See MCL 500.3107(1)(a). This also means that medical expenses cannot be claimed as damages against an at-fault driver. Yet we often forget that the same rules do not apply to claims for lost income that so frequently follow a serious auto collision.

Insurance coverage starts with the policy, and the policy is a contract, so the words of the contract control. No-fault coverage is different in that the statute is the policy, but for liability coverage, it is the language that controls.

"The rules of contract interpretation apply to the interpretation of insurance contracts. The language of insurance contracts should be read as a whole and must be construed to give effect to every word, clause, and phrase."
