Motion to approve October 7 minutes : Williams Second: Kolb

Council approved by unanimous vote.

Motion to approve November 4 minutes: Fisher Second: Nettleton

Council approved by unanimous vote.

- **Treasurer's Report:** Kolb no news from the State Bar, more to more after Winter conference; no further questions
- **Amicus Committee**: Jostock v Mayfield Twp., et al: <u>Williams</u> presented following information Fisher & and Williams writing brief, thus far; discussed GLS sharing expenses with MTA; \*MML LDF telephone conference with Williams; some uncertainty about filing brief since Township not participating. "What is role of the amicus?' Not necessarily endorsing Township;

Forsythe – recommends MLL and GLS do joint brief; more authors will possibly join; he will get back to GLS; draft will be provided to MML before filing- focus on the law and statute and not representing the township. Forbush: time frame question; order was dated 10/18/2023; costs & contributions: MTA = \$10,000; GLS – is usually \$15,000 for Supreme court briefs; Kolb – Property section will not be taking a position. Fisher: the approach is a clarification and not a broadening of of the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act, conditions not new uses; Mills: asked if the counties (MAC) had been invited. Williams: had not communicated with the counties., but will reach out to them; (Counties have zoning authority in Upper Peninsula); Steele & Forsythe: where townships do not have zoning authority, the counties have the authority; Nettleton – agreed with Fisher's approach; Is MTA's position consistent with GLS? Williams – absence of township from Court of Appeals and Supreme court makes it "messy". Forbush – confirm with MTA to minimize conflict. Best to do brief with MML

Sakorafos v Charter Twp. of Lyon (Attachment C) - <u>Kolb</u>: firm (Rosati) currently handling matter; handled by previous insurance carrier; facts are incorrect, Incorrect standard for the standard for standing; township is no longer party to the case; letting decision stand is of concern to municipalities; amicus support would help before the kennel files appeal; there is still lots of time; <u>Williams</u>: will discuss further with amicus committee; will take a deeper dive into reading and researching the case.

Theme of conference discussion – Law Enforcement (?)

Topics:

- Jails/lockups sheriff & police operations; Collective Bargaining Agreements
- Labor Law;
- Elections;
- Telecommunications <u>Watza</u> *ITC*, 115-mile path through the state; need proactive approach; Chubb 5G and small cells; Forsythe preemption.

Supreme Court speaker: Clement—Fisher: Clement Could help or assist with preparation of amicus briefs;

Forbush - agrees with Fisher

Berstein invited last year but was unavailable.

**9.** <u>Council Comments</u> <u>Fisher</u>: recreate a zoning and land use committee; Forbush – asked how to form the committee; <u>Mills</u> – need to establish a committee purpose <u>Watza</u> – also create a fix in response to telecommunications industries.

**Fisher – made motion to create committee** – *Zoning, Land Use and Local Control; purpose of the committee would be to review pending legislation and case laws to refer to amicus committee* and maintain local control; Watza – also create a fix in response to telecommunications industries.

Second: Joppich Joppich: asked if this would be a broad er scope on zoning and land use

Fisher – answered yes; Mills – asked if composition of committee- just council or outside members of the section? Joppich: will it have non-lawyers, like Planners? Watza – planners have already been approached by telco. Industries, but would be good idea to invite them to committee;

Fisher – answered, yes authority comes back to the GLS council. Joppich – county planners would be good, too Thomas – agreed with Joppich he is interested on being committee.

Committee volunteers: King; Watza; Forsythe; Thomas; Fisher – will chair committee

## Motion passes with unanimous approval

Kester: new OMA legislation - retirement boards energy agencies able to meet via electronic/remote meetings; he will share with group.

Fisher – asked if this will broaden use of electronic /remote meetings. Kester: answered no; there is not traction to advance electronic meetings for all entities. Mills – MAC had legal assistants working on that traction; she will follow up; Forbush – present at Winter conference

Joppich – discussed local control and storm water management; Senate Bill 660 authorizes storm water utility; referred to committee and there is upcoming hearings; he will send to the group; Five to six communities have utility but no legislative support; Civil engineers' report – Michigan is low with storm water management infrastructure(footnote -Bolt :cannot charge fees like most states)

McGee: municipal friendly bill; empowers municipalities to get policy results; Brown, Joppich and Mithani on related committees. It took bill a long time; storm water fee still viewed as a tax...

Pastula: asked about term of the newly formed Zoning Land Use & Local Control committee; Fisher: answered that it would continue subject to non-productivity; original motion amended by Fisher to include this information; Second: Joppich . unanimous approval by council

Forsythe and Kester: there are new energy bills in Lansing impacting municipalities; purpose would be to educate legislature;
