The program was well received. We recommend continuing small academic style programs that benefit members on a wide range of topics. Lawyers from around the entire state could participate. — and did.

The zoom program was handled by Fortz Legal who provided an excellent service. They did not charge us for the program. I was advised that their participation and assistance has created a great deal of new business for them, and they decided to not charge us.
