The Uniform Securities Act (2002) was introduced in the Michigan legislature on July 10, 2007 as House Bill 5008 (primary sponsor: Bill Huizenga). The Bill passed the House on April 30, 2008 by a vote of 106 to 0. On May 1, 2008, it was assigned to the Senate Committee on Banking and Financial Services. Predictions are being made that the Bill will continue its progress through the legislature.
