Law School Academic Achievement	Discussion took place on evaluating and extending the Academic Achievement Desgram
Program Evaluation (Nicole Stratton)	Discussion took place on evaluating and extending the Academic Achievement Program. The award resolution was amended in 2019 to continue the award program through 2021.
	Discussion took place regarding more detailed criteria. At one time, the Section required a paper and students did not submit the paper so it was done away with. The board decided to keep the general eligibility requirements and not make any changes.
	Motion: To continue the Academic Achievement Program for 2 more years (2023) and increase the number of scholarships awarded to two \$1,500 scholarships for each of the five Michigan Law Schools. The motion was unanimously approved.
Annual Meeting Recap	Nicole discussed the Annual Meeting Evaluation results that were included in the board materials. The speakers all received 4s and 5s with 5 being excellent. The members indicated that they enjoyed the program and that the topics were of high-quality and practical. There were three suggestions for improvement as follows: 1) Consider shorter presentations on a variety of topics vs. two presentations. 2) Send the slides in advance.
