Libby Public Schools takes pride in providing a top-notch, well-rounded educational system that helps students prepare for the world ahead of them. We instill a love of learning for all students beginning in elementary school. Our high school leverages effective curriculum strategies to ensure that all students are college and career-ready.

The Libby School District serves a surrounding community of 11,000 with Libby Elementary School (grades K-6), Libby Middle/High School (grades 7-12), Libby Central Charter School (grades 9-12) and Plummer Center for preschool ages 4-5 (the building houses our preschool program and the Headstart program).

The total student population is approximately 1,140 students, 160 staff members. Grade levels average 85 students.

Libby High School is classified as a Class A school in Montana for the Montana High School Assn. (MHSAA). It participates in the Northwestern conference, competing alongside schools like Whitefish and Polson. The high school offers Advanced placement and Dual Credit classes.

Libby Preschool

Libby is fortunate to be able to offer a free, public preschool program for all 4-year-olds in our community. This early intervention program located at Plummer School is designed to accommodate 4- and 5-year-old children in meeting academic and social emotional standards necessary for success throughout their academic career. The preschool curriculum is aligned to Libby Public Schools mission and is directly guided by Montana Content Standards for Kindergarten. 4-year-old students may qualify under Libby School Board Policy #3110.

The Community



Lifestyle

Libby is a small, scenic town in northwestern Montana, located along the Kootenai River near the Cabinet Mountains. It is the county seat of Lincoln County. Glacier National Park is about a two-hour drive to the east, and the Canadian–U.S. border is roughly eighty miles to the north. Spokane, Washington is 165 miles to the southwest, and the Idaho–Montana border lies about 32 miles to the west.

With a population of over 11,000, Libby and the surrounding area blend natural beauty with small-town charm, supported by local shops, eateries, and a relaxed pace. The region also preserves its logging and mining heritage in museums and historic sites, including the Libby Dam. Libby is served by Cabinet Peaks Medical Center, a 25-bed critical access hospital offering a wide array of medical services.

Outdoor recreation is year-round with many lakes, creeks and rivers close by. Enjoy boating and fishing on Lake Koocanusa to hiking/mountaineering the Cabinet Mountains Wilderness which offers almost 95,000 acres of rugged, mountainous terrain in the Kootenai National Forest. The Wilderness is southwest of Libby, with more than 30 trails lead into the Wilderness Area. Halfway between Libby and Troy, walk the Kootenai Falls Swinging Bridge for breathtaking views of the Kootenai River gorge and falls 10 meters below. The Ten Lakes Scenic Area near Eureka also offers hiking and swimming in rugged backcountry. Community life features rodeos, festivals, and other events that add to the area's charm.

General Responsibilities

Libby Public Schools is in search of a full-time, dynamic and energetic 7-12 Middle High School Principal. This is a unique opportunity for the right individual.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Chief administrator of the Middle/High School building.
- Primary responsibility is for the day-to-day operation of their building.
- Develops and administers a quality educational program within the guidelines and standards developed by the Board of Trustees and the Office of Public Instruction.
- Monitors classroom instruction and evaluates performance of teachers and professional staff.
- Supervises, oversees, and evaluates performance of clerical, cafeteria, janitorial staff, and other classified employees to maintain quality support services.
- Carries out supervisory responsibilities in accordance with Board policies and rules, regulations, and directives.
- Develops and maintains good working relations with community organizations and leaders.
- Holds frequent meetings and conferences with teachers, students, and parents to deal with educational and discipline problems.
- Acts as liaison between parents and professional staff in operating programs for students with learning disabilities, physical or psychological limitations, and other special needs.
- Maintains a visible presence in the building and playground to enforce safety and security standards for students and faculty.
- Works with staff to prepare yearly budget requests and monitors spending to conform to budget restrictions.
- Supervises allocation of equipment, educational material, and supplies in conformance with approved expenditures.
- Supervises preparation of attendance reports, test results, and other reports as required by the Office of Public Instruction and other agencies.
- Responsible for control and discipline of students.
