












The School District

Lincoln is the home of the mighty Lynx. Lincoln's public school serves all students in the Blackfoot Valley, from Rogers Pass to Ovando, pre-K through 12th grade, at its beautiful location across from Hooper Park and the Lewis and Clark Public Library on the east side of town.

Lynx academics are second to none. The pre-k through 12th-grade staff are experienced and knowledgeable and work hard to help students grow into lifelong learners where they can be successful in whatever they choose to do in life.

Grades K-6 self-contained classes: 87 students

Grades 7-8: 16 students Grades 9-12: 45 students

TOTAL of 148 students in the District with 19 teachers with various other staff/support members.

Junior High students compete in Volleyball, Football, Basketball and Track and Elementary students compete in Basketball.



- 5. Parents and community involvement and support are essential for effective schools.












The Community


Located just west of the Continental Divide, Lincoln is 80 miles east of Missoula, 86 miles southwest of Great Falls, and 60 miles northwest of Helena. Halfway between Yellowstone and Glacier National Parks, Lincoln is bordered by the magnificent Bob Marshall and Scapegoat Wilderness areas to the north and the renowned Blackfoot River to the South. The Bob Marshall/Scapegoat Wilderness Complex sprawls over one and one half million acres of pristine wilderness on both sides of the Continental Divide.

Among the vast array of rare animals, the rugged wilderness supports the only population of grizzly bear in the lower 48 outside of a national park. The taxidermy display at the Lincoln Ranger Station showcases one of the largest grizzly specimens ever seen in the region.

Sculpture in the Wild is located just east of Lincoln. This park stands to celebrate the rich history of the Blackfoot Valley through an exploration of the area's natural environment, history, and culture. Even the entrance shocks visitors, towering overhead, the braided branches welcome guests. The art is both permanent and temporary and brings together elements of the natural environment while telling Montana's story. A variety of events are hosted in the park, each year an artist in residence is brought in, as well as musicians to perform in the featured TeePee Burner (part of the Montana Memory Project).

The Blackfoot River, made famous by Norman Maclean's A River Runs Through It, flows from Lincoln to Missoula, and features seventy five miles of blue ribbon trout fishing and some of the best floating in Montana. There are alpine lakes and the many mountain drainages surrounding Lincoln. There are over 200 miles to hike, backpack, or mountain bike through acres of beautiful country.

Lincoln is a mecca for snowsports. The area offers over 250 miles of groomed snowmobile trails and events and races throughout the winter. The Lincoln area also features in the annual Race to the Sky Sled Dog Race. This grueling 350 mile race runs through some of Montana's most majestic mountains, and right through the town of Lincoln.

The Superintendent must be a strong advocate for the District and work closely with all constituents as it relates to continued funding to support academic success.


The Superintendent must be able to develop a clear vision for the District which supports excellence in education and instruction.
