Goals

- 1. Workshop participants review state of the art theory and practice of "first-gen" student success given germane new enabling/constraining legislation/policy.
- 2. Senior leaders learn how to use first-generation student success initiatives to advance equitable student success *principally via institutional and cultural reform*.

Suggested Pre-work

- Teams review the proposed University of California System and in-place MIT grading policies, Curricular Analytics, UNL Dashboards, Student Experience Project, Chicago Roadmap 2.0 transfer success, and other institutional reform initiatives.
- Summit teams inventory institutional and cultural barriers rooted in social class (e.g., affordability, belonging and accessibility, transfer student experience, etc.).

Principal Workshop Activities

- Participants learn how to use primarily academic policy and practice form to reduce barriers to equitable student success that are especially beneficial for first-gens.
- Participants explore leadership strategies for effective framing first-gen initiatives.

- Behind-the-scenes discussion of do's and don'ts for framing first-gen initiatives.
