

Level 1 - BASIC INSPECTOR – Alternate nomenclature (*Inspection Tester*)

AFTER SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF CIP LEVEL 1, THE BASIC INSPECTOR HAS “ENTRY LEVEL” KNOWLEDGE OF ALL REFERENCED COMPETENCIES AND CAN PERFORM BASIC NON-DESTRUCTIVE INSPECTIONS OF LIQUID COATINGS APPLIED BY BRUSH, ROLLER OR SPRAY TO STEEL SURFACES UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LEVEL 2 OR 3 INSPECTOR WHEN WORKING IN A SHOP SETTING OR A LEVEL 3 INSPECTOR WHEN WORKING IN A FIELD SETTING.

Level 2 - INTERMEDIATE INSPECTOR – Alternate nomenclature (*Inspection Technologist*)

AFTER COMPLETING TWO YEARS OF INSPECTION RELATED WORK AND SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF CIP LEVEL 2, AN INTERMEDIATE INSPECTOR HAS A “WORKING KNOWLEDGE” OF ALL REFERENCED COMPETENCIES IDENTIFIED FOR LEVEL 1 AND 2 AND CAN UNDERTAKE UNSUPERVISED NON-DESTRUCTIVE AND DESTRUCTIVE INSPECTIONS OF LIQUID AND NON-LIQUID COATINGS APPLIED TO ANY SUBSTRATE WHILE WORKING IN A SHOP SETTING OR UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF LEVEL 3 CERTIFIED INSPECTOR WHEN WORKING IN A FIELD SETTING.

Level 3 - ADVANCED INSPECTOR – Alternate nomenclature (*Inspection Specialist*)

AFTER COMPLETING FIVE YEARS OF INSPECTION RELATED WORK AND SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE CIP LEVEL 3 PEER REVIEW ORAL EXAM, AN ADVANCED INSPECTOR HAS “EXPERT KNOWLEDGE” OF ALL REFERENCED COMPETENCIES IDENTIFIED FOR LEVEL 1, 2 AND 3 AND CAN UNDERTAKE UNSUPERVISED NON-DESTRUCTIVE AND DESTRUCTIVE INSPECTIONS OF LIQUID AND NON-LIQUID COATINGS APPLIED TO ANY SUBSTRATE. THE ADVANCED INSPECTOR HAS PROVEN THEIR TECHNICAL KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITY TO COMMUNICATE REGARDING PRACTICAL ISSUES THAT MAY ARISE ON SITE AND IS CAPABLE OF SUPERVISING BASIC AND INTERMEDIATE INSPECTORS.
