Message from the **President**

Dear St. Louis Pediatric Nurse Practitioners,

The U.S. Census Bureau (2018) reported 6.1 million Missouri residents with nearly 23% (1.4 million) residents under the age of 18 years. According to the American **Association of Nurse Practitioners** (AANP), only 4.6% of all nurse practitioners (NPs) in the U.S. are pediatric nurse practitioners (PNPs) (AANP, 2018). In Missouri, there were 503 PNPs with a document of recognition to practice in 2015 (Missouri State Board of Nursing, 2015). I estimate there are now about 550 PNPs currently practicing in Missouri to assist in serving 1.4 million children (or a quarter of our Missouri state residents). This is NOT enough! Of the seven schools of nursing in the St. Louis and surrounding area, four offer a PNP-primary care program and only one offers a PNP-acute care program. The Pediatric Nursing Certification Board (PNCB) reported the average annual enrollment into a PNP program is 6-8 students (PNCB, 2018).

With such low enrollment and high demand in Missouri, more PNPs are needed to care for our children. I ask you to speak with your best pediatric registered nurse (RN) colleagues and encourage them to consider a career as a PNP. The St. Louis area has several excellent PNP programs and most employers have a tuition assistance program.



For those who might argue they are "more marketable" as a family nurse practitioner (FNP), please tell them this is a myth. Currently in St. Louis, there are over 70 PNP jobs available (https://www.indeed.com/q-Pediatric-Nurse-Practitioner-l-Missouri-jobs.htm 1). A PNP is educated and trained specifically for the needs of children; whereas, an FNP receives very limited training when caring for children. Employment offers from a pediatric practice are greater for the PNP than for an FNP, especially in the St. Louis area. And finally, if their passion is caring for children (not adults), they should follow their passion as they may find themselves practicing primarily with adults and potentially becoming unhappy with their work.

Finally, I ask those of you who are currently practicing to support your profession by precepting an NP student (after your first year of PNP practice). The need for quality clinical (residency) training is critically important. You can make a difference in the care delivered to children by participating in the training of future PNPs!

I look forward to another productive, professionally supportive year for our profession in 2019!
