Tempe Arizona last weekend. Nurse Practitioner Leaders from Region 9 (HI, CA, AZ, and NV) were in attendance.

Legislative Update: Shannan Stephenson

Are you certified? AB 1436: Unlike the table of legislation that follows, this bill is moving right along. Sponsored by the California Association of Nurse Practitioners (CANP) and introduced on 2/23/2007, AB 1436 amends the Nursing Practice Act, requiring that nurse practitioners be certified by a nationally recognized certifying body approved by the Board of Registered Nursing. As of 1/30/2008, the current version was finally passed (all ayes) and read for the first time by the Senate.

SCHIP: On Jan 23rd the House failed to override President Bush's veto of legislation to expand the State Children's Health Insurance Program (HR 3963), falling 14 votes short of the 2/3s majority required. Democrats have been pushing for this expansion arguing, "Worsening economic conditions will increase demand for SCHIP and Medicaid. A million more children a year may need public health insurance." (New York Times 1/24). Despite their efforts to persuade Republicans to agree with this legislation, they have failed to garner the support necessary. Per Rep. Joe Barton (Texas) the unwavering "Republicans' position is: Continue the existing program, perhaps expand coverage somewhat for families above 200% of poverty and cover every child in the country under 200% of poverty" (Congressional Quarterly Today, 1/23/08).

Lucky for our low-income kids, the House approved legislation (S 2499) to extend funding for SCHIP through March 2009. This funding will cover children who are already enrolled, and who are below the 250% of poverty level.

State Dental Checkup Law: A new state law requires all children entering public schools' kindergartens to have had at least one dental checkup.

Bye-bye California Healthcare Reform... Although passed by the Assembly, Governor Schwarzenegger's health care reform legislation (ABX1 1) did not pass the Senate on 1/28/08. While the bill would have been funded by employers, employees, a hospital fee, and a \$1.75 tobacco tax, Democrats who voted against the legislation cited a financial report that found the state could actually be greatly indebted by the bill if costs exceeded expectations (California Healthline, 1/29/08). It is interesting to note that Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama's health care reform plans are very similar in scope to ABX1 1. It is hopeful that national support of this type of reform would provide the resources to diminish some of the Democrat's financial fears.

Meanwhile, Senate President Don Perata is suggesting that lawmakers work to adopt some of ABX1 1's individual components (California Healthline, 1/29/08).

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

3rd Annual PNP Conference, Soaring to Expertise


