Community Outreach Update

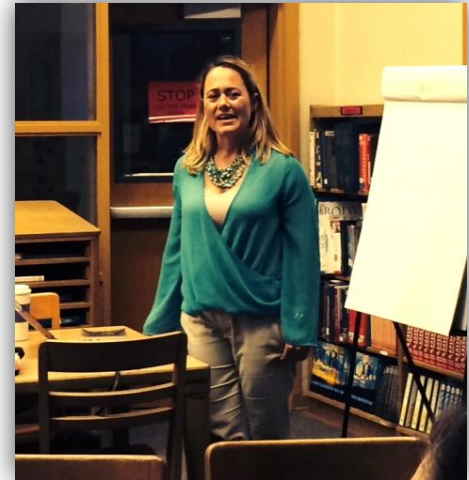
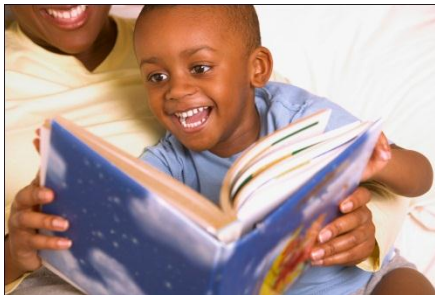

Member Spotlight

Debbie Harris, RN, MSN, PNP

"Education is never a waste of time. Be sure to always learn, study hard, get your degrees," was my mom's mantra. I took this to heart and headed to nursing school receiving my BSN. from Mount Saint Mary's College in 1988, my Master's in Nursing in the Clinical Nurse Specialist program from UCLA in 1991, and completing the Pediatric Nurse Practitioner Program at CSULB in 1994. I obtained both my primary care and acute care PNP certification

The year was 1990. I was taking care of a beautiful, teenaged girl from Belize who was affected by Sickle Cell Disease and was suffering terribly. Not only was she having a vaso-occlusive pain crisis to her legs and back—described by many as more painful than a bone fracture—she was also having an aplastic crisis where her marrow was suppressed, and severe anemia. I was diligently giving her IV morphine, warm packs, IV fluids, and getting another IV started so I could give her a blood transfusion. As I walked out of the room, I saw that she had grabbed the IV tubing and wrapped it around her neck. She was wailing when I ran into her room. She told me that she wanted to die. She was having a hard time with our treatments, as she was used to the herbal remedies used in Belize and rarely gave blood. Her disease was overwhelming for her—and that was it for me. I knew I had to do something to help persons affected by sickle cell disease—to do my best to address the physical, cultural and psychosocial impact of this condition.

This is the journey that I have taken for the past 23 years. I began my APN career in 1991 at Children's Hospital Los Angeles with

the Hematology Program. I have collaborated with the Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) Foundation of California, volunteering as a camp nurse and have been involved in SCD teen groups. I helped start the West Coast Sickle Cell Nurses group, which will host the Third Annual West Coast Sickle Cell Nurses Conference, "Concepts to Clinical Reality," at CHLA on August 4, 2014.

I have received several honors and awards, including: the Alpha Tau Delta, Professional Nursing Fraternity, Member of the Year 2009; the *NurseWeek* Nursing Excellence Award for Patient Advocacy for the State of California, 2003; and the NAPNAP-LA 'One of our Own Award for Excellence in the Performance of the Nurse Practitioner Role' in 2007. For the past decade I have worked to implement a clinical ladder for nurse practitioners at CHLA. Recently I advanced to the NP-3 role at CHLA, and am currently the incoming chairperson for the Nurse Practitioner Clinical Ladder committee at CHLA.

I have been able to educate the public about sickle cell disease on TV shows, in newspapers, in magazines, and at community events. I have been able to educate nurses about sickle cell disease at symposiums and in nursing and medical journals. Most importantly, I have been able to continue to learn about the healthcare needs of my patients from the families that I care for and from my colleagues.

As I watch my twin daughters, Holly and Lexi, aged 13, work diligently on their science projects for school on the lymphatic system and the digestive system, inquiring, "Mom, did I get this right? Does it make sense?", **I can say with confidence, that choosing nursing as a career and being involved with NAPNAP-LA has made a lot of sense for me as I continue to grow and learn from all those around me.**

Joana R. Duran, RN, MSN, CPNP, CNS

Joana R. Duran, RN, MSN, CPNP, CNS, NAPNAP-LA's 2014 Outstanding NP Award recipient, has excelled in clinical practice, research, mentorship, collaborative practice and advocacy. Ms. Duran specialized in the management and treatment of pediatric hematology-oncology patients at Harbor UCLA from 2008 to 2012. Ms. Duran developed an Evidence-Based Practice (EBP) proposal for a nurse practitioner-run clinic for the Long-Term Follow-Up (LTFU) of childhood cancer survivors, implemented several systems changes and formal procedures for the success of this clinic, and served as primary provider for this clinic. Ms. Duran has participated in research and contributed to multiple journal articles with regard to pediatric blood disorders, as well as co-authoring a handbook for families of children with Thalassemia.

Ms. Duran is currently serving as the legislative chair of NAPNAP-LA, president of the UCLA School of Nursing Alumni Association Board of Directors, and is an elected member of the Research & Evidence-Based Practice Committee of the Association of Pediatric Hematology/Oncology Nurses.

Ms. Duran's leadership has helped bring our professional organization to a new level of excellence and advocacy; she guided NAPNAP-LA through the strategic planning process of 2011-2012, implemented a Legislative Tracking System for NAPNAP-LA members and facilitated NAPNAP-LA's sponsorship of "**Read Across California**," a bill (ACR-62) which addresses the issue of childhood literacy in our state.

Stacey Warner, RN, MSN, CPNP, is the NAPNAP-LA 2014 Scholarship recipient. Stacey has been a member of NAPNAP-LA for over five years. She started her professional career in 1996 as a registered nurse. She continued her education at California State University, Los Angeles and graduated in 2006 with her Masters in Nursing as a pediatric nurse practitioner. Stacey is currently pursuing her Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing at Azusa Pacific University. She would like to complete research in genomic studies, focusing on the pediatric population and autoimmune disorders.

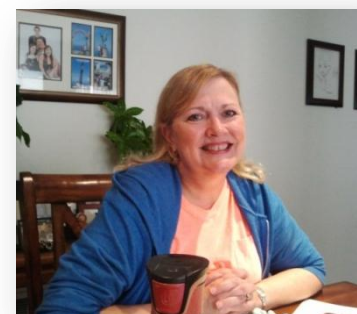
Southwest Regional Conference
