The next Peer Review is tentatively scheduled for the month of September. Details to be announced.


National Conference

National Child Abuse Prevention Month

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month, and the year 2016 marks the 40th anniversary of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA), the first Federal legislation setting minimum standards for child maltreatment definitions and providing Federal assistance to States for prevention, identification and treatment programs. With an estimated 702,000 victims of abuse and neglect nationally (9.4 victims for every 1,000 children in the population) and 1,580 fatalities in the year 2014 (U.S.

population) and 1,580 fatalities in the year 2014 (U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, Administration on Children, Youth, and Families, Children's Bureau, 2016), strides still need to be made to ensure the safety of our children.
