## Critical Congenital Heart Disease (CCHD) Screening in Newborns

Within the last two years, many of the hospitals with obstetrical services in southwestern Pennsylvania and the tri-state area have initiated screening for Critical Congenital Heart Disease (CCHD) in newborns. CCHD is a title designated

*Critical Congenital Heart Disease (CCHD) accounts for approximately 3% of deaths in the United States.*

for the seven congenital heart diseases (CHD) that are typically classified as cyanotic heart defects. These CHD's include hypoplastic left heart, pulmonary atresia (PA), tetralogy of Fallot (TOF), total anomalous pulmonary venous return (TAPVR), transposition of the great arteries (TGA), tricuspid atresia (TA) and truncus arteriosus (TA). These defects account for approximately 3% of deaths in the United States (US) and are usually discovered prenatally or shortly after birth. It is estimated that just under 300 infants each year are discharged

## Legislative Updates

**State news:** The Pennsylvania Coalition of Nurse Practitioners (PCNP) has positioned us to move forward in pursuit of full practice authority. House Bill 1063, sponsored by Senator Vance (also a nurse) with 16 co-sponsors, stipulates that as a licensed independent practitioner, we will be recognized as primary care providers under health plans and can be reimbursed

directly by 3<sup>rd</sup> party payers. This will not change our scope of practice nor will it extinguish our collaborative relationships with physicians; it will merely support our ability to practice within our scope as independent practitioners who seek collaboration as needed. While licensing requirements remain the same, nurse practitioners

**Federal news:** NAPNAP's Health Policy Committee has a new chair as Mary Chesney moves into her position as president. Laura Searcy, who was previously a member-at-large, now chairs the committee. ## New Guidelines for Completing the PIAA CIPPE

The PIAA Sports Medicine Committee, the PIAA Board and the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics have developed new guidelines for completing the PIAA Comprehensive Initial Pre-Participation Physical Evaluation (CIPPE) form. These new guidelines became effective on June 1st for the 2013-2014 school year.

The CIPPE should not be signed prior to June 1st and will remain in effect until May 31st of the

following year regardless of when the form was signed.

Parents MUST complete and sign Sections 1-5 of the CIPPE paying particular attention to Section 5: Health History. Completion of the form is needed prior to the physical exam, so that it can be reviewed with the PCP.

The physical exam including the musculoskeletal exam can be completed during a office visit on or after June 1st. The child's

home from hospitals in the US with unrecognized CCHD that could be treated. Early detection may assist in identifying those newborns with structural heart defects usually associated with hypoxia in the newborn period that could have significant morbidity or mortality early in life.

In 2009, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and the American Heart Association (AHA) found compelling reason for recommending routine screening for CCHD. In September 2010, the Secretary's Advisory Committee on Heritable Disorders in Newborns and Children (SACHDNC) recommended that critical congenital cyanotic heart disease be added to recommended screenings based on findings from a comprehensive evidence review, including two studies from Sweden and Germany with nearly 80,000 total infants. In 2011, the SACHDNC, in collaboration with the AAP, the American College

of Cardiology (ACCF) and the AHA convened a working group to outline strategies for implementation of routine pulse oximetry screening as a method for early detection of CCHD in well-baby and intermediate care nurseries in which discharge within the first week of life is common.

CCHD screening in the newborn nursery is completed using the technology of pre- and post-ductal pulse-oximetry comparison. Pre-ductal screening is a pulseoximetry reading from the right upper extremity and post-ductal screening is a pulseoximetry reading from any of the remaining extremities. Testing typically occurs after 24 hours of life and prior to discharge. Many hospitals have chosen a standard time such as 36 hours of life for routine testing to occur. A negative screen for CCHD occurs when at least one of the pulseoximetry readings is greater than 95% and the difference between the two readings is less than or equal to three percent. A positive

screen for CCHD occurs when either result is less than 90% or the difference between the two readings is greater than 3%. An initial positive screen is generally repeated. If the repeat screen is also a positive screen for CCHD, the infant should be transferred to an NICU and an echocardiogram (ECHO) is warranted.

Parent and family education during this process is essential and it is helpful to have education materials available to supplement bedside teaching. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) offers a free one-page education handout in English or Spanish and can be located on the CDC website

complete medical record should be reviewed including any ER or specialist visits. If any concerning information (syncope, elevated blood pressure) is obtained either by physical exam

and/or review of the medical record, the patient will need to return for another exam prior to certifying the student for participation.

in Pa. will be licensed as a certified nurse practitioner who meets licensing requirements for RN's and is certified by a nationally recognized, population-focused specialty organization. This differs from the current practice of the state issuing a certificate to a nurse practitioner who is licensed only as an RN; our new title will be APRN-CNP (advance practice registered nurse, certified nurse practitioner). Terri Bailey and I attended

Lobby Day in Harrisburg on May 7 with 100 other nurse practitioners to support the introduction of this bill to our legislators. Please contact your legislator to ask to be a co-sponsor or to thank him/her as a co-sponsor for this very important bill that will facilitate the implementation of the Affordable Care Act by removing significant barriers to practice at a time when more

and skills to help parents deal with issues more than just childhood asthma and ear infections. Parents may come to you because their child is being bullied in school or because they are concerned about poor choices that their teenager is making with peers. Providing counseling and reassurance can be just as valuable as any lab, test, or medication you will order.

Prior to becoming a PNP, I worked as a registered nurse in the pediatric intensive care unit at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh for six years. My experience in acute care has helped

me transition to primary care by allowing me to expand my list of differential diagnoses with rare, yet more serious problems. Even if I see four kids in the same day all with a chief complaint of a sore throat, I don't want to group them all in the same category. I want to keep in mind there may be an underlying condition that cannot afford to be missed or have a delayed diagnosis. It is exciting and challenging to learn a new environment and a new role. Being involved in an organization such as NAPNAP is beneficial for PNP's to stay connected with each other, for educational opportunities, and for local resources related to the profession.

# 2013- 2014 Scholarly Grant

## **Purpose**

The Three Rivers Chapter of the National Association of Pediatric Nurse Practitioners (NAPNAP) encourages registered nurses or nurse practitioners who are enrolled in a Doctorate of Nursing (DNP) program to search for evidence that can improve the health of children and adolescents. Implementing evidence-based projects that improve patient outcomes in pediatric patients can contribute to far-reaching benefits for children and adolescents.

**Requirements:** Grant applications must meet the following criteria:

1. Documented acceptance in an approved neonatal, pediatric or family nurse practitioner program.
2. Letter of recommendation must be completed and signed by the capstone committee chair of the applicant.
3. Letter of recommendation must be completed and signed by NP program coordinator documenting enrollment in NP program.
4. Completed application and all attachments must be received by **November 30, 2013**  
2 copies, 1 without name for blinded review, should be submitted to Brenda, DNP, RN, CPNP-PC, [legislative chair, cassb@pitt.edu](mailto:legislative_chair_cassb@pitt.edu).
5. Preference will be given to a Three Rivers NAPNAP student member.

**Application Process:** Provide 2 copies of each of the following supporting documents with application (one copy without name or identifying information for blind review):

1. A summary statement of no more than 100 words prepared by the applicant that addresses each of the following:
  - (1) Why you chose this topic for capstone project
  - (2) How you see the outcomes of the project contributing to the health of children and adolescents.

2. Abstract (500 words) of capstone project including: literature review for evidence-base, significance, aims of project, population and clinical practice site, implementation and measurement of patient outcomes.
3. Documentation of any previous work done in area of capstone project.
4. Budget describing intended use of funds.
5. Curriculum Vitae or Resume
6. One letter of reference that address your potential as a professional leader as a pediatric or family nurse practitioner.

### **Selection Process**

1. Executive Board will perform a blind review of applications and supporting documentation and make recommendation to board for a vote.
2. The grant recipient, determined by the Three Rivers Chapter of NAPNAP board, will be notified within 1 month of the application deadline.
3. The \$500 grant will be awarded in January 2014.
4. The recipient will be formally recognized at the Annual Symposium in February 2014.

### **Basis of Award**

6. Preference will be given to a Three Rivers NAPNAP student member.

**Application Process:** Students must submit the completed application form with required attachments by deadline. Provide 2 copies of each of the above supporting documents with application (one copy without name or identifying information for blind review). The \$500 scholarship will be awarded in January 2014. The scholarship recipient will be determined by the Three Rivers Chapter of NAPNAP Board and notify recipient of award within one month of the application deadline. The recipient will be formally recognized at the Annual Symposium in February 2014.

Please contact your legislator to support the bill and remove this barrier to care for our patients by signing on as a co-sponsor. Example letters can be found at NAPNAP's advocacy tab on their website. Another barrier to practice is the recent CMS ruling that requires a face-to-face encounter

by a physician for an excessive list of Durable Medical Equipment (such as nebulizers), even if ordered by nurse practitioners. The vote on this ruling has been postponed to October and a sample letter to educate your legislator can also be found on NAPNAP's website.
