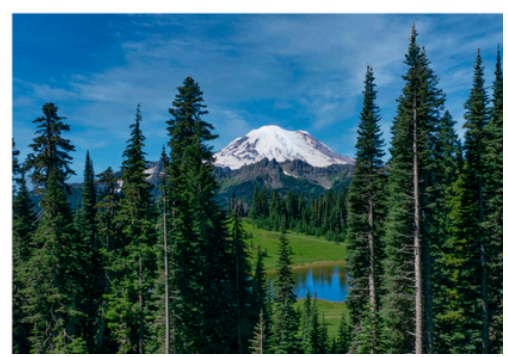
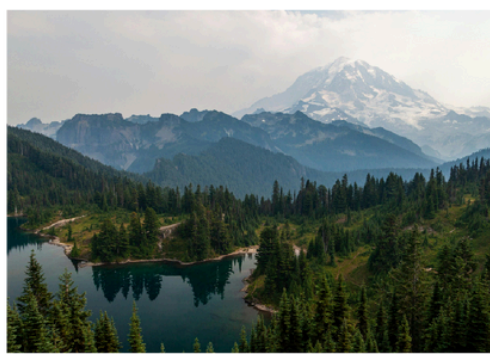

PEHSU: A Pediatric Environmental Health Resource for WA PNPs



Early life exposures to biological, chemical, and radiological hazards in the environment can contribute to many childhood conditions, such as adverse birth outcomes, developmental disorders, intellectual delays, asthma, and childhood cancers. Environmental exposures are a source of avoidable childhood morbidity and mortality, considerable parental stress, and significant healthcare expenses (1).

As evidence for environmental factors as an important determinant of children's health grows, so too has media attention and parental concern. Ideally, parents turn to healthcare professionals as a trusted source of information. Exposures can be complex to address as many variables determine the potential health risks. Most healthcare curriculums contain limited content on environmental health and may leave providers feeling unprepared to respond to parental concerns or to identify and manage environmental-related illnesses.

The Pediatric Environmental Health Specialty Units (PEHSU) program is a not-for-profit network of experts established to assist health professionals address pediatric and reproductive environmental health issues through free consultation and educational services.

Northwest PEHSU is based at the University of Washington and serves providers in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Alaska. Northwest PEHSU can help you

- Understand possible health effects from past or present exposures
- Identify clinically relevant tests for exposures and/or interpret test results
- Determine whether a child's symptoms could be environmentally related
- Use evidence-based practices for addressing or preventing exposures (medical management, risk communication, exposure risk assessment)

The PEHSU network also offers factsheets, trainings, and tools for healthcare providers. To request to speak with a PEHSU specialist, call (206)-221-8671 or email pehsu@uw.edu. You can also request a specialist to give a presentation on a topic or suggest future outreach and educational activities or materials. Visit pehsu.net/ for pediatric environmental health resources.

The PEHSU is a resource for addressing non-acute exposures that do not present a medical emergency. Call the Washington Poison Center at (800)-222-1222 for immediate assistance with a suspected poisoning. By staying informed and proactive, you can help children have a safer, healthier future!
