
What does the acronym TRACS stand for?

TRACS

Tracking and Reporting Actions for the Conservation of Species

Why Enhanced TRACS

- User-Friendly and Intuitive
- Standardize reporting, reduce redundancy
- Public reporting nationally to tell the WSFR story
 - Meet Federal reporting requirements




Facilities/Lands Modules

- 2 CFR 200.329 "Federal awarding agencies or PTEs must require their non-Federal entities to report on the status of real property in which the government retains an interest..."
- DOI (thru publication of the FAIR) is requiring bureaus to comply using the SF-429. WSFR has requested deviation to comply using TRACS modules.
- Tracking accomplishments is more meaningful

Lands/Facilities Modules progress

- June 13: Communications protocol opened for comments on these modules.
- June 18-19: WSFR staff held 2 national webinars to explain TRACS modules designed to meet these reporting requirements. (150 participants)
- July 19: Comment period closes.
- August 13: Comment reviewed by TRACS WG.
- August 19: Results presented to JTF.
