Annual Meeting Wrap Up

2012 NASBP Annual Meeting in Orlando, Florida

Rindt presented Amstutz with the John “Jack” J. Curtin, Jr. President’s Award for his outstanding service to the Association.



Amstutz received a framed certificate (held by Amstutz) personally inscribed in two-toned color calligraphy highlighted in gold and signed by the NASBP President, as well as, a specifically minted NASBP President’s medallion (held by Rindt) customized with the NASBP logo and made of 2-troy oz. .999 fine silver.

Rindt said he chose Amstutz as the recipient for this prestigious award because Amstutz has dedicated nearly fifty years to the surety industry as an underwriter and a producer and has been a “steadfast ambassador for surety professionals, the surety product, and NASBP.” “Amstutz has readily assumed volunteer leadership positions and was a key contributor to the Association’s first online course; he continues to serve as a faculty member of the NASBP William J. Angell Surety School and mentors others to envision opportunities in the industry,” Rindt said.

The award, named the “John ‘Jack’ J. Curtin, Jr. President’s Award,” honors an individual, who is chosen by the NASBP President for outstanding service contributions during the President’s term to the Association and to the surety industry. The award was first presented in 2007 to John ‘Jack’ J. Curtin, Jr., for whom the award is named.
