FASN Director's Message

On behalf of FASN and the National Association of School Nurses (NASN), I'd like to extend best wishes for a safe and

relaxing holiday break. Your unwavering support for students in need of mental and physical health care can have an enormous impact on your mind, body and spirit. Be sure to maintain a healthy relationship with yourself, so you can stay sharp, motivated and healthy! Please be sure to practice selfcare as you care for others! Thanks for your expertise, passion and dedicated service in support of student health.

As I begin my fifth and absolutely last year representing Florida on the board of the NASN, my commitment to professional school nursing remains strong. My work on the NASN Executive Committee is over and I no longer chair the Advocacy and Membership Strategic Committee, but as your Director, I still attend monthly meetings and am honored to also be a member of the Professional Practice Document Advisory Committee. I am excited to work alongside NASN directors, staff and officers to advocate for the critical role of school nurses.

My work with NASN has taken me on a few adventures! Here's a great example: in the Spring of 2018, I traveled to the CDC in Atlanta to participate in a CDC/NASN Roundtable event. This resulted in the development of a White Paper released a year later "Translating Strategies into Actions to Improve Care Coordination for Students with Chronic Health Conditions", and an opportunity to record a podcast for NASN School Nurse Chat - Students with Chronic Health Conditions - The Importance of Parents and School Nurses Working Together. It was such a wonderful experience to discuss challenges and develop strategies for collaboration between parents and school nurses in support of students with chronic conditions. I hope you will read, listen and share these amazing resources that validate your work!

Locally, as a member of the recent State Surgeon General's School Health Ad Hoc Committee, I am excited to share that a report has been issued. Recommendations include legislative appropriations to increase school health services and develop/implement a standardized data infrastructure for documentation, consolidation of school health funding into one revenue source, update our state Medicaid plan to align with federal policy, utilization of Title IV, Part A funding for school nursing allocations, use of telehealth in schools, and requiring districts to include the registered school nurse in mental health plans. If we are to make a difference in the lives of our students, school nurses must continue their advocacy work - have courageous conversations with school boards, district leaders, and local legislators, armed with county (or school) specific data. We know that one in four students in the U.S. may have a chronic health condition and here in Florida, our data tell us that this number may be greater. Students with chronic health conditions deserve access to a registered professional school nurse all day, every day to ensure health and safety.

The NASN board of directors representing states from across the nation will meet again in January in our nation's capital to review and approve revised position statements, celebrate successes, and finalize our new strategic plan for 2020-2023. During the NASN board of directors annual "trip to the hill", I'll have an opportunity to discuss the legislative priorities of NASN and Florida school nurses with our state legislators.

FASN believes that YOU are uniquely positioned to help your school community identify and develop creative ideas, supports and partnerships committed to improving student health and access to care. Together, we must make sure that stakeholders understand what school nurses do and how they can make a significant and sustainable contribution to students' academic success, and lifelong health. We look forward to seeing all of you at the 24th Annual FASN Conference in February where you can learn more about your role as Essential Advocates for Safe and Supportive Schools!
