

SCHOOL EMERGENCY TRIAGE TRAINING



This training is designed specifically for school nurses and will provide nurses with the knowledge, skills and training resources to lead school-based Disaster Response Team and to perform triage in response to mass casualty incident (MCI) events.

Increasingly, and unfortunately, schools are becoming common ground for mass casualty incidents. Schools which are informed via planning and personnel training increase the effectiveness of both response and recovery. The training will prepare school nurses to be a leader in emergency planning and response within schools.
