## **NASN2026 Presentation Submission Rating Instructions**

NASN2026 is a national conference. Presentation submissions accepted for the In-person and Virtual NASN2026 events must reflect readiness for a national stage. To ensure this, score submissions using the following rating scale for each criterion:

- **5** = Exceeds expectations and criteria (Exceptional)
- **4** = Meets criteria and exceeds in some categories (Above Average)
- **3** = Meets criteria (Average)
- 2 = Meets some aspects of criteria but missing key criteria (Below Average)
- 1 = Does not meet any criteria at all (Unacceptable)

## Presentation submissions must address the NASN2026 Conference Learning Outcomes:

- Describe one concept you learned at the NASN Annual Conference that promotes shared leadership in diversity, equity, and inclusion for all students' well-being.
- Explain how the use of data establishes a foundation of ethics, excellence, and integrity for school nursing practice.
- Apply the knowledge learned at the annual conference that will impact your daily nursing practice to ensure students are healthy, safe, and ready to learn.
- Identify two processes you will use to implement an evidence-based practice you learned at NASN's annual conference
- Identify two new evidence-based practices or resources from NASN's Annual
  Conference (sessions, exhibitors, or poster presentations) that can be used to promote academic success and the health of students and communities.
- Identify strategies that prioritize the physical and mental well-being of the school nurse, students, and school staff.

## **Presentation Submission Evaluation Criteria**

- 1. The overall topic is timely and relevant to one or more of the NASN2026 learning outcomes.
- 2. The presentation content matches the learning track chosen.
- 3. The author(s) show how this presentation could advance the discipline of school nursing or represent the voice of today's school nurses.
- 4. The content is organized and has clarity.
- 5. The author(s) provide evidence-based best practice references in APA format.
- 6. The learning engagement activities implemented must be learner-centered strategies appropriate for live or virtual sessions to enhance learning.
- 7. The author(s) use grammar, punctuation, and spelling correctly.
- 8. The presentation addresses the Social Drivers of Health in relation to the topic.
- 9. The presentation demonstrates how the topic is related to the School Nursing Practice Framework<sup>TM</sup>.
- 10. One of the presenter listed is a former or current school nurse.
- 11. The presentation is free of commercial bias.
