Hinkley Named Executive Director of the National Association of School Nurses

Silver Spring, Maryland [May 30, 2023]— Terri Hinkley, EdD, MBA, BScN, RN, CAE has been named Executive Director of the National Association of School Nurses, effective August 7, 2023. She will succeed Donna Mazyck, MS, RN, NCSN, CAE, FNASN who retired April 28, 2023. An experienced RN with deep connections across the nursing spectrum, Hinkley currently serves as the Chief Executive Officer of the Medical-Surgical Nursing Certification Board, is President of the American Board of Nursing Specialties, and sits on the Board of Directors for the Institute for Credentialing Excellence. Previously she was the Workforce Innovation Officer at the Association of Clinical Research Professionals and is an adjunct professor at George Washington University. In 2020, Terri advocated for the medical-surgical nursing anti-racism pledge and an intentional DEI commitment. Terri's doctorate focused on organizational learning, specifically, how to prepare the workforce for the future.
