We evaluate and respond to the emergency needs of students and adults in our buildings, whether it is an individual with a known health concern or not. Examples include administering an epipen for anaphylaxis, assisting a student with severe hypoglycemia emergencies, first aid for choking, or providing CPR. Since our practices vary greatly throughout the state, it is difficult to define what it means to save a life. While in almost all cases, 911 will have been called, if you have saved a life you will know.
