In my first five years of school nursing I never attended the FASN conference. Every year, the nurses that did attend would come back and present information at our meetings, full of excitement and energy. I was excited to go to work and I felt more prepared than I had previously been. I now understand the excitement of my fellow school nurses when they came back from the FASN conference. It was like a breath of fresh air that I will need each and every year.

What are YOU doing in February??? Believe it or not, a visit to Orlando is just what is needed to blast away those mid-winter blahs!!! No—not the parks!!!



On behalf of FASN and the National Association of School Nurses (NASN), I'd like to ex-

tend best wishes for a safe and blessed holiday break. Many counties across our state are still struggling with recovery from Hurricane Michael and the road back for some will be long. Your support for students experiencing trauma and those in need of mental and physical health care is invaluable to your school communities. Thanks for your expertise, passion and dedicated service in support of student health.

As I begin my fourth and last year representing Florida on the board of the NASN, my commitment to professional school nursing is stronger than ever. As one of four Directors serving on the NASN Executive Committee and now chair of the Advocacy and Membership Strategic Committee, it is exciting to work with directors, NASN staff

and officers each month to support NASN's strategic plan and advocate for the critical work of school nurses.

In July, the NASN board of directors approved a Gun Violence -Position Brief describing gun violence as a "public health crisis" that is "devastating to communities across the nation". Please consider joining other health professionals across the nation who are supporting a petition asking Congress to consider measures that would prevent gun violence and promote a safe and supportive health environment for all children. The NASN also released a position brief related to the reunification of refugee or immigrant children separated from their families and worked with Futures Without Violence to develop an infographic for school nurses to help students heal from trauma.

If we are to make a difference in the lives of our

students, school nurses must begin to have courageous conversations with school boards, district leaders, and local legislators, armed with county (or school) specific data. We know that one in four students in the U.S. may have a chronic health condition. Students with chronic health conditions deserve access to a registered professional school nurse all day, every day to ensure health and safety.

The NASN board of directors representing states from across the nation will meet again in

February in our nation's capital to review and approve revised position statements, celebrate successes, and identify strategic opportunities for growth. During the NASN board of directors annual 'trip to the hill', I'll have an opportunity to discuss the legislative priorities of NASN and Florida school nurses with our state legislators.
