Floor Action:

Set Loc Cal Bill set on Local & Uncontested Calendar. Special House/Senate committee sets this calendar. Bills "knocked off" if a very few members object.

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Wdrwn Loc Cal Bill was withdrawn or "knocked off" Local Calendar because of opposition.

Set Intent Cal Senate bill author/sponsor has given notice that intends to ask to be recognized by Lt Gov to lay out bill for debate and vote.

Passed Reg Bill passed on the Regular Calendar
