HB 195	Gonzalez, Mary(D)	Relating to provisions and plans by public schools to ensure the safety of individuals with disabilities during a disaster or emergency situation. Remarks: This bill would create guidelines for required provisions in school districts' emergency operations plans for students with disabilities and require IEPs to address necessary accommodations during disasters for such students. SB 1625	Lamantia, Morgan (F)(D)	Relating to menstrual disorders education and informational materials for public school students. Companions: HB 1298 Dutton, Harold (Identical) 3- 3-23 H Introduced and referred to committee on House Public Education Remarks: This bill would allow school districts to provide informational materials to students regarding menstrual disorders and symptoms, such as endometriosis. Bill History: 03-06-23 S Filed
SB 1919	Miles, Borris(D)	Relating to the employment of full-time registered nurses at public schools. Companions: HB 181 Thierry, Shawn (Refiled from 87R Session) HB 1139 Thierry, Shawn (Identical) 3- 2-23 H Introduced and referred to committee on House Public Education Remarks: This bill would require schools to employ at least one full-time nurse at each campus and maintain an average ratio of one nurse for every 750 students. Bill History: 03-08-23 S Filed
SB 2535	Menendez, Jose(D)	Relating to the use of prescription glucagon medication on public and private school campuses. Companions: HB 2891 Talarico, James (Identical) 2-27-23 H Filed Remarks: This bill would allow glucagon to be prescribed in the name of a school. The school could maintain the glucagon, and it could be administered by a school nurse or an unlicensed diabetes care assistant. Bill History: 03-10-23 S Filed
SB 2544	Blanco, Cesar(D)	Relating to the reimbursement under Medicaid of local educational agencies for the provision of health care services to students. Companions: HB 1571 Lozano, Jose (Identical) 3- 3-23 H Introduced and referred to committee on House Human Services HB 2773 Bucy, John (Identical) 2-23-23 H Filed Remarks: This bill would allow LEAs to bill Medicaid for any services covered by Medicaid that are provided to any student eligible for Medicaid.
