HB 98 Moody, Joe(D) Relating to the provision of on-campus mental health services by a school district and reimbursement under Medicaid for certain services provided to eligible students.

Remarks: This bill would allow school districts to contract with LMHAs and enroll as providers under the Medicaid

program.

HB 920 Klick, Stephanie(R) Relating to the use of medication designated for treatment of respiratory distress on public and private school campuses.

3-8-23 S Committee action pending Senate Education

Remarks: This bill would remove the requirement that a student have a written notification that the student has been diagnosed with asthma in order for them to receive treatment from a school nurse for respiratory distress. It would also allow other school personnel to administer the medication and require training for those persons to do so.

Bill History: 03-21-23 H Voted favorably from committee on House Public Education

HB 1238 VanDeaver, Gary(R) Relating to the school health and related services program, including parental consent for program services, the establishment of a school health and related services program advisory council.

Remarks: This bill would create a SHARS advisory committee, which would be tasked with advising HHSC on

implementing the SHRS program, incorporating changes to federal law governing the program, and publishing the procedures manual.

HB 2726 Klick, Stephanie(R) Relating to the practice of nursing, including disciplinary procedures of the Texas Board of Nursing.

Remarks: This bill would create a process for the expunction of nurses' disciplinary records. To be eligible for expunction, the nurse would be required to complete any disciplinary order, agreed settlement, or alternative dispute resolution impose by the BON. It would also require the BON to consider whether the nurse committed additional violations and the seriousness of previous violations when determining expunction eligibility. Finally, it would also clarify that a person licensed outside of the state, but practicing nursing in Texas pursuant to an

emergency waiver, would be subject to the jurisdiction of the Texas Board of Nursing.
