HB 114	Thompson, Ed(R)	<div>Relating to the possession of e-cigarettes on public school property or at certain school events.</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would make the possession of five or more e-cigarettes a Class B misdemeanor. It would also allow school personnel to confiscate and report possession.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-11-23 H Voted favorably from committee as substituted House Public Education</div>
HB 195	Gonzalez, Mary(D)	<div>Relating to provisions and plans by public schools to ensure the safety of individuals with disabilities during a disaster or emergency situation.</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would create guidelines for required provisions in school districts' emergency operations plans for students with disabilities and require IEPs to address necessary accommodations during disasters for such students.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-12-23 H Reported from committee as substituted House Select on Youth Health &amp; Safety 04-12-23 H Recommended for Local and Consent Calendar</div>
HB 1149	Swanson, Valoree(R)	<div>Relating to requiring parental consent for psychological or psychiatric examination, testing, or treatment conducted by a school district employee.</div> <div><b>Companions:</b> SB 400 Hall, Bob (Identical) 2-15-23 S Introduced and referred to committee on Senate Education</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would broaden the definition of psychological and psychiatric treatment and examination, which requires parental consent in school. Treatment would include use of a method, technique, or substance that is designed to affect behavioral, emotional, or attitudinal characteristics.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-18-23 H Meeting set for 8:00 A.M., E2.036 - House Public Education</div>
HB 1238	VanDeaver, Gary(R)	<div>Relating to the school health and related services program, including parental consent for program services, the establishment of a school health and related services program advisory council.</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would create a SHARS advisory committee, which would be tasked with advising HHSC on implementing the SHRS program, incorporating changes to federal law governing the program, and publishing the procedures manual.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-11-23 H Voted favorably from committee as substituted House Human Services</div>
HB 1297	Dutton, Harold(D)	<div>Relating to vision screenings for students in public or private school.</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would allow students to be screened using an electronic eye chart.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-13-23 H Reported from committee as substituted House Public Education 04-13-23 H Recommended for Local and Consent Calendar</div>
HB 2411	Talarico, James(D)	<div>Relating to the use of opioid antagonists on public and private school campuses and at or in transit to or from off-campus school events.</div> <div><b>Companions:</b> SB 629 Menendez, Jose (Identical) 3- 8-23 S Committee action pending Senate Education</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would add opioid antagonists to the current epinephrine laws that apply to school campuses.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-13-23 H Reported from committee as substituted House Public Education</div>
HB 2891	Talarico, James(D)	<div>Relating to the use of prescription glucagon medication on public and private school campuses.</div> <div><b>Companions:</b> SB 2535 Menendez, Jose (Identical) 3-23-23 S Introduced and referred to committee on Senate Education</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would allow glucagon to be prescribed in the name of a school. The school could maintain the glucagon, and it could be administered by a school nurse or an unlicensed diabetes care assistant.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-13-23 H Reported from committee as substituted House Public Education</div>
HB 3610	Clardy, Travis(R)	<div>Relating to a seizure management and treatment plan for the care to be provided by a public school to a student with a seizure disorder.</div> <div><b>Companions:</b> SB 1506 Hughes, Bryan (Identical) 3-16-23 S Introduced and referred to committee on Senate Education</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would create new requirements for the form required by TEA for seizure management and treatment plans.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-20-23 H Meeting set for 8:00 A.M., E2.036 - House Public Education</div>
HB 4058	Cortez, Philip(D)	<div>Relating to the use of opioid antagonists on the campuses of public and private schools and institutions of higher education and at or in transit to or from off-campus school events.</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would add opioid antagonists to the school epinephrine and asthma laws.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 04-14-23 H Voted favorably from committee as substituted House Public Health</div>
SB 294	Johnson, Nathan(D)	<div>Relating to the use of medication designated for treatment of respiratory distress on public and private school campuses.</div> <div><b>Companions:</b> HB 920 Klick, Stephanie (Identical) 3-29-23 H Reported favorably from committee on House Public Education</div> <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would remove the requirement that a student have a written notification that the student has been diagnosed with asthma in order for them to receive treatment from a school nurse for respiratory distress.
