HB 114	Thompson, Ed(R)	Relating to the possession of e-cigarettes on public school property or at certain school events. <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would make the possession of five or more e-cigarettes a Class B misdemeanor. It would also allow school personnel to confiscate and report possession.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 05-02-23 S Referred to Senate Committee on Senate Education</div>

HB 2694	Jones, Venton (F)(D)	Relating to a notification requirement if a public school does not have a nurse, school counselor, or librarian assigned to the school during all instructional hours. <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would require a school to notify parents if they do not have a full-time nurse, school counselor, or librarian on staff.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 05-02-23 H Meeting set for 8:00 A.M., E2.036 - House Public Education 05-02-23 H Committee action pending House Public Education</div>
HB 2726	Klick, Stephanie(R)	Relating to the practice of nursing, including disciplinary procedures of the Texas Board of Nursing. <div><b>Remarks:</b> This bill would create a process for the expunction of nurses' disciplinary records. To be eligible for expunction, the nurse would be required to complete any disciplinary order, agreed settlement, or alternative dispute resolution impose by the BON. It would also require the BON to consider whether the nurse committed additional violations and the seriousness of previous violations when determining expunction eligibility. Finally, it would also clarify that a person licensed outside of the state, but practicing nursing in Texas pursuant to an emergency waiver, would be subject to the jurisdiction of the Texas Board of Nursing.</div> <div><b>Bill History:</b> 05-01-23 H Reported from committee as substituted House Public Health 05-09-23 H Set on the House Calendar</div>
