Concussion (mTBI) Magagement: Assessment and Accommodations

ADAM TERRELL, MS CCC-SLP, CBIS

The presentation will review and provide information regarding the following: concussion (mTBI) definition, best assessment practice, accommodation management, appropriate classroom modifications, and planning for a successful return to classroom learning.

The Legislative Process, SNOM's Role, Updates in MN, and Data Collection

An overview of the legislative process and how it relates to the school nursing field will be addressed. Discussion of current topics will occur, including: how to get involved and promote legislative change, insight on data collection for school nurses and how it can be used to provide a voice for staffing and school health needs. We will also review the results of 'Every Student Counts' data collection for MN with focus on the use of regional staffing models.

Frequent Fliers: Anxiety, School Refusal, and What Nurses can Do

School nurses play a vital role in the identification and management of anxiety within the school context. This presentation will provide nurses with the knowledge and tools necessary to identify anxiety in a school setting and to support anxious youth when caring for them, with a particular focus on anxiety-driven absenteeism and anxiety-based school refusal.

Trauma Responsive Resilience Focused Health Rooms

School Nurses are in the front lines of recognizing the impact of chronic stress and trauma. Through this program, they will be reminded of the impact of trauma and ACES. Nurses will be affirmed for resilient focused strategies they are using along with learning about the the Circle of Courage which is a research evidence based model for building resilience which has Native American Roots

Neuromuscular Disease in the School Setting

MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM FROM GILLETTE CHILDREN'S

This session will be focused on providing medical and treatment updates for students who have genetic neuromuscular disease, which has changed immensely over the past 10 years. Our medical team understands the incredibly valuable role that school nurses play in the everyday lives of our patients--often serving as unofficial medical liaisons for the academic teams in addition to providing nursing care--and we hope to use this time to update, educate, and empower nurses so they can best care for our patients in the school setting.

When Standing Feels Like Too Much: Recognizing and Advocating for Dizzy and Misunderstood Teens with POTS

CHRISTINA MCCARTHY MS, APRN, CPNP-AC/PC

We will discuss recognition of signs and symptoms of adolescent POTS (Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome), understand its epidemiology and diagnostic criteria, and differentiate it from other conditions with overlapping symptoms. Attendees will gain insight into the daily challenges students with POTS face. You will learn practical behavioral strategies along with an overview of medication options used in treatment. Most importantly, you will be empowered to advocate for appropriate school accommodations and provide informed, compassionate support that helps affected students thrive academically and socially.

Navigating Cross Cultural Conversations Centered on Health

JODY NELSON ED.D, LMFT

This workshop will explore the cultural dynamics that are sometimes present when school nurses engage parents in conversations centered on their child's health. Cultural factors related to mental/emotional health will be considered. Participants will reflect upon their own cultural biases related to wellness and will consider how their perspectives may create barriers to understanding and collaboration. Strategies to work effectively cross-culturally will be demonstated and practiced.
