4. Overview of SAA Strategic Planning TTA program
 - a. The Justice for All Reauthorization Act, passed in December 2016, requires all applicants for FY2019 Byrne JAG state formula grant awards to include a statewide strategic plan that addresses resource allocation, use of data and implementation of evidence based practices.
 - i. Plan must be developed in consultation with a diverse group of stakeholders; defined in the Act.
 - ii. The plan must describe the evidence-based approaches to be used and illustrate how funding will be allocated. States will be required to update their strategic plans every five years.
 - iii. Details of new federal law on page 2 of handout
 - b. NCJA w/funding from BJA, offers training and technical assistance to SAAs to support your strategic planning efforts and implementation of evidence-based practices
 - c. Key differences include the emphasis on implementation of evidence-based policies, how states use data to inform priorities and resource allocation, and evaluation of program outcomes
 - d. TTA designed to help states meet the 2019 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant requirement of a comprehensive statewide strategic plan.
