Mr. Edward Stanhouse is the Deputy PEO, Intelligence Surveillance Reconnaissance and Special Operations Forces, Air Force Life Cycle Management Center, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio.

Mr. Stanhouse started his career serving the Air Force since 1982 as a commissioned officer and a civil servant. While serving in the United States Air Force he gained experience in all phases of the acquisition process including research, development, test & evaluation, production and sustainment. He has worked in a broad range of programs including aircraft, training systems, missile and classified ground and space programs and held acquisition and operational leadership positions in national space programs. Mr. Stanhouse provided acquisition oversight and policy formulation for special operations forces and low intensity conflict capabilities under the Office of the Undersecretary of Defense (Policy), as well as performing program and budget oversight for Air Force mobility, special operations, and training programs at Headquarters Air Force.

Mr. Stanhouse was Commander, 516th Aeronautical Systems Group, serving as director of the C-17 acquisition and sustainment program. He also served as Director, Requirements and Capabilities Integration Directorate, responsible for ensuring the Aeronautical Systems Center's enterprise capabilities were integrated to meet warfighter needs, leading enterprise capability-based planning prior to initiation of several emergent acquisition programs. Mr. Stanhouse most recently served as chief of the USAF Helicopter Program Office and HH-60W system program manager.
