Qualifications/Method of Nomination: All engineers are eligible for nomination, provided they are members in good standing of one of the following New Hampshire engineering societies:

- American Council of Engineering Companies of New Hampshire (ACEC-NH)
- American Society of Civil Engineers – New Hampshire Section (ASCE-NH)
- American Society of Heating, Refrigerating & Air-Conditioning Engineer - Granite State Chapter (ASHRAE-NH)
- American Society of Mechanical Engineers – Northern New England Section (ASME-NNE)
- Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers – New Hampshire Section (IEEE-NH)
- New Hampshire Public Works Association (NHPWA)
- New Hampshire Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE-NH)
- Northern New England Institute of Transportation Engineers (NNEITE)
- Society of American Military Engineers – Piscataqua Post (SAME-Piscataqua Post)
- Society of Woman Engineers Southern New Hampshire (SWE SNH)
- Structural Engineers of New Hampshire (SENH)
- Women’s Transportation Seminar – New Hampshire Chapter (WTS-NH)

The nominee should not be informed of being considered for an award. All nominations not selected for an award shall remain anonymous and the candidate shall not be informed of their nomination.

Eligibility Requirements:

Engineer of the Year (EOY):

1. Member in good standing of their engineering society.
2. Licensed professional engineer (P.E.) in the State of New Hampshire or an Engineer-in-Training (E.I.T.).

Young Engineer of the Year (YEOY):

1. Member in good standing of their engineering society.
2. 35 years of age or younger on December 31, 2025.

Nomination Format: Applications should be prepared without the participation of the nominee in any way. **Each society is limited to one nomination for EOY and one nomination for YEOY.** If a nomination is from multiple societies, it shall count as nomination for each society. There is no prescribed format to be completed; however, the nomination package must contain the following sections:

- A. Nomination Form
- B. Statement of Nomination
- C. Statements of Recommendation
- D. Candidate Profile

Selection: A jury which may include up to one representative from each New Hampshire engineering society will select the candidates to be recognized as EOY and YEOY.

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Guidelines for the Application Package

A. Nomination Form:

The nominating person(s) shall be a member of the nominating society and complete the attached Nomination Form. The form requires endorsement by an authorized member of the board of directors of the nominating society.

B. Statement of Nomination:

The nominating person(s) shall be a member of the nominating society and prepare a statement supporting the selected candidate for consideration for the Engineer of the Year (EOY) or Young Engineer of the Year (YEOY) Award. The nominating statement shall be signed and dated by the nominating person. The nomination statement shall be addressed to “The New Hampshire Engineering Societies” under the care of the current EOY/YEOY coordinator. *The statement of nomination shall be a maximum of two pages.*

C. Statements of Recommendation:

Statements or letters shall be written by someone knowledgeable of the candidate’s achievements and characteristics worthy of consideration to support the nomination. These statements shall be written to provide a concise picture of the candidate as an outstanding engineer and shall be signed and dated by the author. *Applications shall contain a maximum of five statements of recommendation, with a minimum of two from engineers. Statements of recommendation shall be a maximum of two pages.* All statements shall be addressed to “The New Hampshire Engineering Societies” under the care of the current EOY/YEOY coordinator.

D. Candidate Profile:

The candidate profile shall cover the following items:

1. Education (including continued education) and Licensure (see eligibility requirements)
2. Memberships (technical and non-technical organizations)
3. Engineering/Industry experience
4. Technical excellence
5. Service to the profession
6. Individual as a person

Additional information as applicable to the merits of the candidate’s engineering acumen may be included. Some examples include engineering research and development experience; technical and non-technical papers authored; patents held; service to the community; honors or awards bestowed (technical, professional, governmental, educational, and civic); or unusual engineering assignments. The intent of the candidate profile is to provide a clear portrait of the candidate as an outstanding engineer who has exhibited exemplary behavior in their interactions with society and the environment.
