Student poster abstract: 150-300 words Due by 1/25/2019

INTRODUCTION

- * Significance of the issue
- * Clear concise justified statement of purpose of project

METHOD

- * QI framework, stakeholders, setting, project components, project timeline, outcome and process measures identified

RESULTS

- * Outcome and process measure findings

CONCLUSION

- * Conclusions based on findings, next steps or practice change recommendations

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- Email notification of abstract acceptance will be sent to the presenting author only by January 30, 2019.
 - The authors' failure to return the "intent to present" and CE required bio information will disqualify the abstract from presentation
 - An individual may submit more than one abstract; however, if successfully reviewed, only one submission will be accepted for presentation as a podium presentation
 - If successfully reviewed, final abstract acceptance will be conditional upon registration by the presenting author.
 - PowerPoint presentation must be uploaded by the identified deadline.
