Keynote Speaker: Dr. Tanya Cohn

Dr. Cohn is a second career nurse who has practiced as a Medical/Surgical nurse and in the Adult ICU.

She then found her niche as a nurse researcher in 2008. Dr. Cohn has had the wonderful opportunity to be a Nurse Scientist leading research and evidence-based practice in an acute care hospital. She led the achievement of an exemplar in nursing research during West Kendall Baptist Hospital’s initial Magnet® designation.

In addition, she is full-time faculty in Simmons College’s Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) program where she contributes to course development and supports scholarly activities of FNP students.

Dr. Cohn earned her PhD in nursing from Rush University, Chicago, IL and her MSN in Adult/Women’s Health from Simmons College, Boston, MA. She also earned a Master’s in Education from Harvard University. Dr. Cohn received the 2016 Nurse Researcher award from the Florida Organization of Nursing Executives. She has also been named the 2015 Nurse Research Awardee from FNA and a STTI Rising Star Leader in 2014.

Dr. Cohn’s research interests focus on three global areas—chronic diseases in the community, nursing impact on patient outcomes, and healthy work environments. She also has a passion in psycho-metric testing of tools with a focus of Spanish translation and testing.
