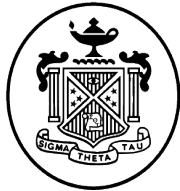

### Robin Remsburg, PhD, GCNS, BC, FAAN

Remsburg is the Director, School of Nursing and Associate Dean, College of Health and Human Services, George Mason University. Prior to this, she was the Deputy Director of the Division of Health Care Statistics at the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) and Chief of the Long-term Care Statistics Branch. Under her direction, the Long-term Care staff completed a major redesign of the National Nursing Home Survey and conducted the first National Survey of Nursing Assistants.



Remsburg is a clinical specialist in Gerontological Nursing and immediate past president of the National Gerontological Nursing Association (NGNA). Her research focus has been on improving clinical care in nursing homes.

Remsburg received her BSN from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, her MSN from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and her PhD from the University of Maryland.
